The court was therefore asked to issue a temporary order restraining Greene and Mitchell from applying for the contract and the bank from surrendering it. It is also asked that Greene be required to account for the property during the time it has been in his possession. The restraining order was issued.

The title of the other suit is the territory, on complaint of C. F. Ainsworth, attorney-general, on relation of E. B. Gage, J. Henry Wood, Con O'Keefe, Aurelio Melgarejo and W. M. Adamson, against William C. Greene, George Mitchell, George A. Treadwell, Scott White and Win Wyllie. The fact of the two meetings held in this city on November 14 is recited. At the first the plaintiffs were elected directors and E. B. Gage president and J. Henry Wood secretary. The defendants were elected directors at the second meeting. The plaintiffs state that all the books and papers of the company are in their possession. They ask for a judgment that they are the directors of the company that the defendants are not and that they be restrained from representing themselves to be. This order was also issued.

The latter suit was evidently begun in order to straighten the record of the plaintiffs in the courts of this territory that they may go before the Mexican courts better fortified.

TOBACCO WORKERS ORGANIZE. Oppose Combinations and Will Not Use Trust Made Goods.

Winston, N. C., Nov. 27.—The National Tobacco Workers' union has organized two branch unions in Winston, one white and one colored, among the employees of the tobacco manufacturing firm of Brown Brothers' company. This firm will hereafter employ only members of the union. The organization has a large membership in the north and west, among factories outside of the trust.

The union is against combinations, and the members promise not to use goods manufactured by the American and other trust companies. Other unions will be organized here among employees of other tobacco factories. It is charged that the trust tobacco firms do not employ any union labor.

PASTOR BECOMES LORD.

Report That Rev. Thomas Drew Is Heir to British Peagee.

Richmond, Va., Nov. 27.—The report has reached here from Chase City that Rev. Thomas Drew, D. D., a Presbyterian minister at that place, has fallen heir to a peerage in England, and also comes into possession of large estates.

Lord Drew is well known in Richmond, where he has served as a pastor for several years. In May, 1883, owing to the illness of Rev. C. H. Read, pastor of the Grace Street Presbyterian church, Rev. Thomas Drew was invited and on October 7, 1883, he was installed as their regular pastor. He served until October, 1888, when he accepted a call to Chase City, Va.

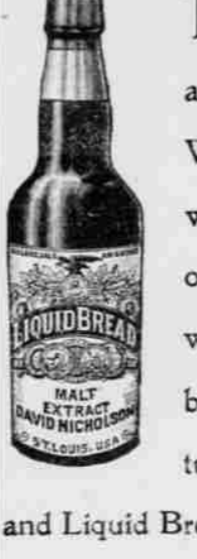
Lord Drew, it is said, has sailed for Europe to investigate his new-found title and wealth. He came from England, and his family is one of prominence under the queen's dominion. The new lord is now about sixty-seven years of age, and has spent his life in the service of the Presbyterian church.

RAILWAY CHARGES ARISON. Seaboard Air Line Resists Judgment for Burning of Ice Plant.

Raleigh, N. C., Nov. 27.—The supreme court will this week hear arguments in a very odd case. The Hygienic Ice company of Charlotte had an ice plant here. One night in August, 1894, the plant was burned. Last year the company sued the Seaboard Air Line for damages to the full value of the plant, setting up the claim that the fire was caused by sparks from a passing locomotive. The superior court gave a verdict for \$20,000 damages.

The railway company has filed a mass of affidavits, mainly by Dennis Rowe, a negro detective from Richmond, stating that a negro had confessed that he saw his brother, then a fireman at the ice factory, set fire to it, and that it was done to get the insurance money.

The ice company a few days ago filed affidavits that Rowe's evidence was false, and that he was not worthy of


