**DEMOCRATS NAME TICKET.**

By a vote of 564 to 537 Gov.  
John F. Shafroth was renominat-  
ed by the Democratic state con-  
vention at midnight Wednesday  
night over Dr. Benjamin L. Jef-  
ferson of Routt county.  
The Denver delegation got run  
over early in the game and did  
not recover until too late to cause  
much trouble.  
There was no opposition to the  
nomination of Rhoady Kenchan  
for state treasurer and his address  
was a classic in rhetoric.  
"Well boys, ye've can say for  
me that I have run the auditor's  
office so that ye've nor none else  
got any monies ye've didn't own  
and I'll run the treasurer's office  
so that them what is don't own  
it won't get it."  
And then came the fight over  
the superintendent of schools, Ka-  
therine M. Cook, the present in-  
cumbent of the office, Helen Ring  
Robinson, Mary C. C. Bradford  
and Roseta Pulford, were all  
placed in nomination. For the  
most part the women in the con-  
vention made the nominating  
speeches and in as much as they  
had been in a bitter fight for  
over two weeks some of the  
speeches bordered very close to  
personality, but Chairman Adams  
kept them in hand to the ex-  
tent that no real trouble occurred  
and as soon as possible he ordered  
the roll call. And then it was all  
over with the other three. Mrs.  
Cook was by far the favorite and  
with the announcement of the  
vote of Larimer county, which  
wasn't half way through the list,  
she had enough votes to nomi-  
nate her.  
Chairman Adams always a dip-  
lomat displayed the greatest  
amount of tact at this point. It  
had been his custom to have the  
defeated candidate escort the win-  
ner to the platform for their  
speeches of acceptance. Adams  
knew that if he named the other  
three to escort Mrs. Cook to the  
platform, the Jeffries-Johnson  
contest wouldn't be in it and he  
gracefully named the women who  
had placed Mrs. Cook in nomi-  
nation and everybody roared.
