Chicago, Feb. 12.—Prospects of drawing up a new working agreement between the major and the minor leagues, at outs for a year, brightened today following a double session between a committee from the minors and one from the National League.

INVESTIGATING OUSTED SOCIALIST DELEGATION Albany, N. Y., Feb. 13.—Delegation from the assembly judiciary committee which is investigating the fitness of the ousted socialist delegation to serve as members of the lower house today made public a brief which charges that the five assemblymen by their pledges and speeches have rendered themselves amenable to the espionage act and should be convicted under its terms.
