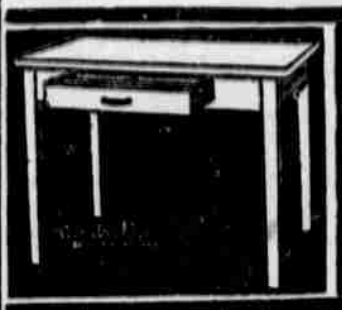
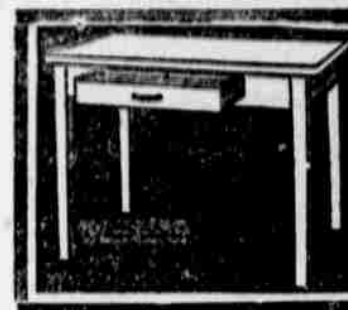

FEDERAL TROOPS OFF FOR FRONT

Brazilian Nationals to Engage Rebels at Sao Paulo

Washington, July 17.—Authentic reports on the revolutionary situation in Brazil received today by the state department from the American embassy in Rio De Janeiro said 3,000 government troops arrived yesterday at Santos and entrained for the Sao Paulo district.

Fifteen thousand federal troops have already surrounded Sao Paulo, the dispatch said, and that city is being bombarded.

A message dated July 12 and forwarded from Sao Paulo said state forces were bombarding the city from Ypiranga and other points. At that time shells had fallen within one-half a block of the American consulate building but no damage to that structure had occurred. The hotel D'Oeste had been struck by a shell, however, and six persons were killed. The advices added that the industrial center, Braz, was being shelled and had been practically deserted by the inhabitants.

Montevideo, Uruguay, July 17.—Fighting between the Brazilian government forces and the insurrectionists at Sao Paulo is continuing without advantage to either side, according to authoritative advices received here early today. Recent arrivals from Santos declare that port is virtually closed and the situation extremely grave.

A prominent South American who arrived in Montevideo on an Italian steamer from Santos in an interview, asserted that the rebels at Sao Paulo apparently were in control and that the federal troops besieging the metropolis have as yet been unable to dislodge them.

Buenos Aires, July 17.—An official communique issued at noon yesterday by the Brazilian government has been received from La Nacion's Rio De Janeiro correspondent. The communique states:

"We are operating an important movement of forces along the entire front. New elements whose organization has been completed are going to enter into the action."

APPROVE LIBERATIONS

Generally, Ireland Feels That Release of DeValera and Stack Will Be Good For All Concerned.

Dublin, July 17.—The release of Eamonn De Valera and Austin Stack, leaders of the Irish republicans, from Arbor Hill barracks, has been well received in all quarters. The independent welcomes the action and believes it will be approved by the country. It says, "the common desire is to bury bitterness and secure unity among all sections willing to work for Ireland's prosperity."

The Freeman's Journal, referring to the proposal of the De Valera followers to repudiate the national loan, declares that "it would not be moral for De Valera to keep silent if those are his ideas." It says: "one cannot be sure that De Valera, as before, may not be resolved to try another round."

Belfast, July 17.—The release of Eamonn De Valera and Austin Stack will not influence the cases of the Ulster prisoners whose liberation will always be conditional on the reports of the police, it is stated. The Irish News, a nationalist newspaper whose chairman is Joseph Devlin, holds that the failure to free the southern chiefs would have ruined the Taltann games.

PLANS FOR EPINARD

Famous French Race Horse To Be Taken to Saratoga During Latter Part of Next Week.

New York, July 17.—Epinard, the French horse which was brought to this country for three races, will be shipped to Saratoga during the latter part of next week to prepare for his first races on the track there, it has been announced by Eugene Leigh, Epinar's trainer.

Meanwhile the chestnut four-year-old is having easy workouts at Belmont park to regain his condition following the trip across the ocean. His exercise yesterday consisted of a slow gallop in the company of other horses from the Greentree stables.

The French horse and the French boxer were photographed in the act of kissing each other, which promoted a wager to remark that "their next kisses will probably be leather, a whip for Epine and a glove for Georges."

Situation in W. Virginia Discussed by President

Washington, July 17.—President Coolidge discussed the situation in West Virginia today with Guy D. Goff, republican candidate for the senate and former assistant to the attorney-general, who declared that all of West Virginia had a friendly feeling for the state's son, John W. Davis, democratic nominee for president, but would give the majority of its votes in November for the republican national ticket.

Mr. Goff told the president that Clarkshurg during the campaign would be one of the most political cities in the country as it is the home of the democratic presidential nominee, the republican candidate for governor, the republican senatorial nominee, the republican candidate for supreme court, the republican national committeeman and of Item J. Shaver, reported under consideration for the leadership of the democratic national campaign organization.
