We live in an age of extremists. We live in an age of iconoclasts, We live in an age of radical references who have the ear of many of the people. The danger to the people is that in a HYSTERIA SUPPOSED REFORM AND A HOPE OF AN IMPOSSIBLE MILLENNIUM the structure of our government may be so seriously affected and the relation between the government and the individual sa substantially changed that it will take years to retrace the unwise step.



THE ONLY LOGICAL AND LEGITIMATE RE-STRICTION UPON LIBERTY IS THAT WHICH IS DRAWN FROM THE LIKE LIBERTY OF OTHERS.


