We Need Staying, Conservative Hand of Supreme Court to Check Popular Clamor

By Former President TAFT at Harvard Commencement Exercises

WE live in an age of extremists. We live in an age of iconoclasts. We live in an age of radical reformers who have the ear of many of the people. The danger to the people is that in a HYSTERIA OF SUPPOSED REFORM AND A HOPE OF AN IMPOSSIBLE MILLENNIUM the structure of our government may be so seriously affected and the relation between the government and the individual so substantially changed that it will take years to retrace the unwise step.

IN SUCH A TRANSITION PERIOD, IN SUCH A TIME WHEN THE SUDDENNESS OF PROGRESSIVE MEASURES SEEMS MORE IMPORTANT THAN THEIR WISDOM, WE NEED THE STAYING, CONSERVATIVE HAND OF THE SUPREME COURT NOT TO PREVENT REFORM BY THE EXERCISE OF POPULAR WILL, BUT TO PREVENT CHANGE BY POPULAR WHIM.

The history of the court in previous political crises and its quiet but effective strength to outlive such attacks upon it as we now see preparing against it should lead all lovers of liberty regulated by law to take courage and whenever every other branch of the government fails us in sane, sound action to LOOK TO THE COURT AS THE BULWARK to save the people from injury by the hasty action of a majority of the electorate.

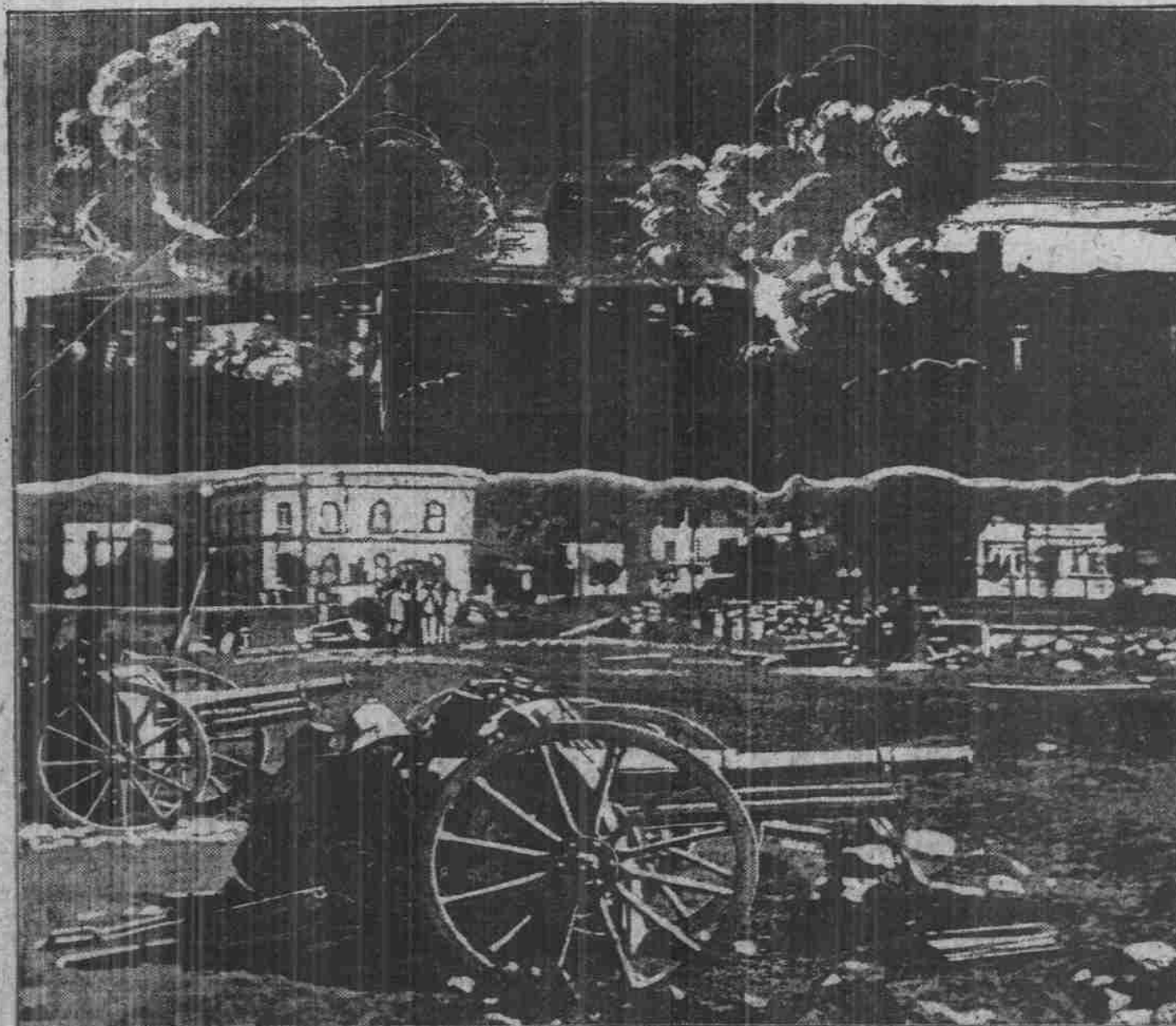
Driving Force In Civilization Found In Liberty and Not In Restriction

JUST as the driving force of an engine is to be found in the steam chest and not in the brake, so the DRIVING FORCE IN CIVILIZATION WILL BE FOUND IN LIBERTY AND NOT IN RESTRICTION. The cycle will in due time and after a colossal waste of energy and of accomplishment complete itself, and LIBERTY WILL ONCE MORE DISPLACE REGULATION AND RESTRICTION AS THE DOMINANT IDEA IN THE MINDS OF MEN. It is worth while to take note, therefore, that, while liberty is not now in the foreground of human thinking and human action, it cannot long be kept out of the place which of right and of necessity belongs to it.

THE ONLY LOGICAL AND LEGITIMATE RESTRICTION UPON LIBERTY IS THAT WHICH IS DRAWN FROM THE LIKE LIBERTY OF OTHERS. THAT MEN MAY LIVE TOGETHER IN FAMILY, IN SOCIETY AND IN THE STATE LIBERTY MUST BE SO SELF DISCIPLINED AND SO SELF CONTROLLED THAT IT AVOIDS EVEN THE APPEARANCE OF LICENSE OR OF TYRANNY.

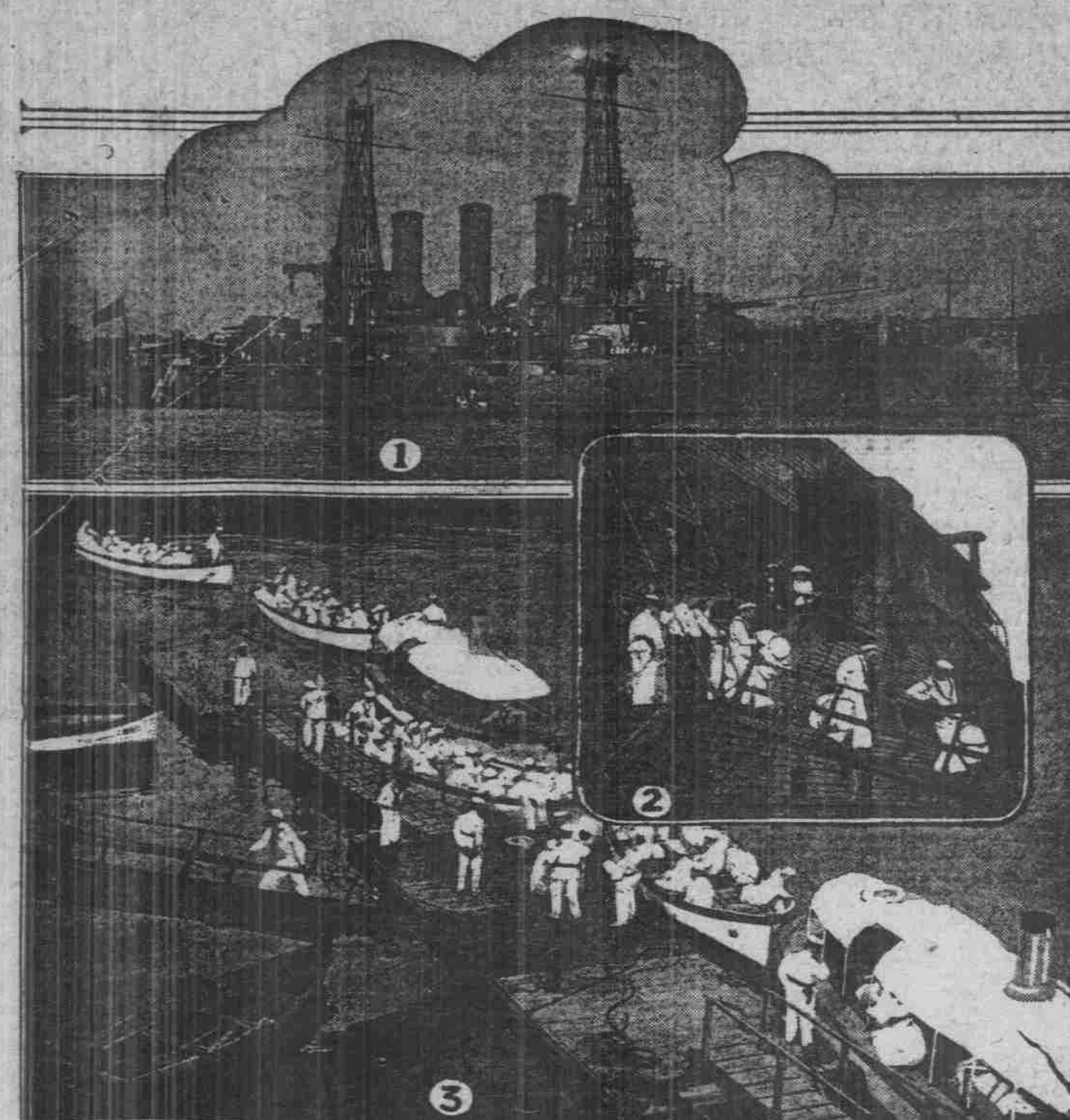
The Success Artesian Well Co., who are driving a well for Frank Wells, have drilled to the depth of 90 feet but have not yet struck water.

Washington, July 2.—Plans have been made for the annual cruise of the naval reserves of the eastern states. They will train this summer on the battleship Rhode Island. The ship will leave Fort Monroe, Virginia, on July 6 with the reserves of North Carolina and the District of Columbia, taking on the Pennsylvania and New Jersey Second battalion at Lewes, Del. The battleship will then go to Bermuda and thence to Tangier sound for target practice and service drills. The ship will start on a second cruise on July 23, leaving New Haven, Conn., with the reserves of Connecticut, Rhode Island and Maine for Halifax. Gun practice will follow in Gardiner bay.

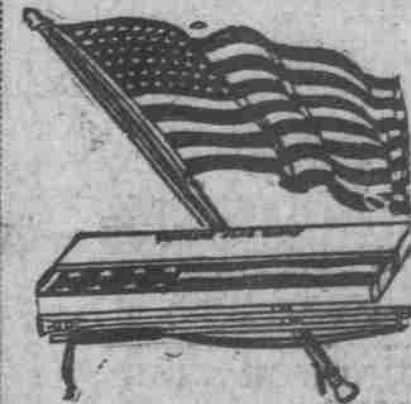
