

GRABOWSKI GIVEN FOUR MONTHS TERM

Three Months on Liquor Count; 30 Days as Drunken Driver

When William Grabowski, aged 27, milkman de luxe, of 264 Clark street, was arraigned in police court today for the third time in two weeks on a charge of violating the liquor law, he was sentenced to three months on the liquor count, and given 30 additional days on a charge of driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of liquor. Bonds for appeal were set at \$1,000 by Judge B. W. Alling.

Sergeant Patrick J. O'Mara said that he and Officer Thomas J. Feeney arrested Grabowski at 1 Clayton road last Saturday morning, after they received a call from Mrs. Mary Castelli of 264 Clark street, who told them where Grabowski was. Sergeant O'Mara said that he stayed in front of the Clayton road house, while Officer Feeney went into the rear of the house and brought Grabowski out. The sergeant said that Grabowski opened the back of his coupe where it is said that two five gallon cans of alcohol and a one gallon can were found. Sergeant O'Mara said that Grabowski said he only drove the car in the driveway of the house, and that "Sparky," a friend, drove from Clark street to Clayton road for him.

Peter Castelli, son of Mrs. Mary Castelli, said that he saw Grabowski drive the car into the yard. He said that he called headquarters after his mother told him that he should. He declared that his mother found that Grabowski had been storing alcohol in her milk house.

Mary Castelli, his sister, said that she saw Grabowski put the cans of alcohol in his car. She also said that she saw Grabowski drive his car down Clark street. She stated that when her mother found the alcohol in the milk house she asked Grabowski to pay nine months' rent. She said her mother demanded not only so that she could secure the information to tell police.

Mrs. Castelli said that Grabowski broke open the lock on the milk house door, and has been storing alcohol there. She said that she asked him for rent only so that he would tell how long he had been using her milk house as a rum depot. She said she found two five-gallon cans of alcohol in the box of the milkhouse, which she put on the back veranda and turned them over to police. Judge William E. Mangan was counsel for Grabowski.

HERESY CHARGED

Indiana Man Having Church Trial Accused Because He Started Recreational Center.

Palmyra, Ind., March 25 (AP)—Declared not to sacrifice any of his principles and prepared to fight in the interest of young people's recreations, Clyde Martin was ready for trial here today before three evangelists of the Church of Christ. He is charged with "heresy" because of his activity in establishing a recreational center in this village. Only members of the church will hear the trial, others being prohibited.

This is the second time the young wanderer for wholesome recreation for the young people of the village has faced the charges charged with "recreational heresy."

Martin last night issued a defiant statement, and said that at his trial today he would, if permitted, "have his opponents outline what may or may not be done outside of worship. I want them to say what we can wear, say and do."

Mr. Martin said in outlining his defense that he proposed to show by comparison that his recreational activities were on a plane with those of his older accusers.




