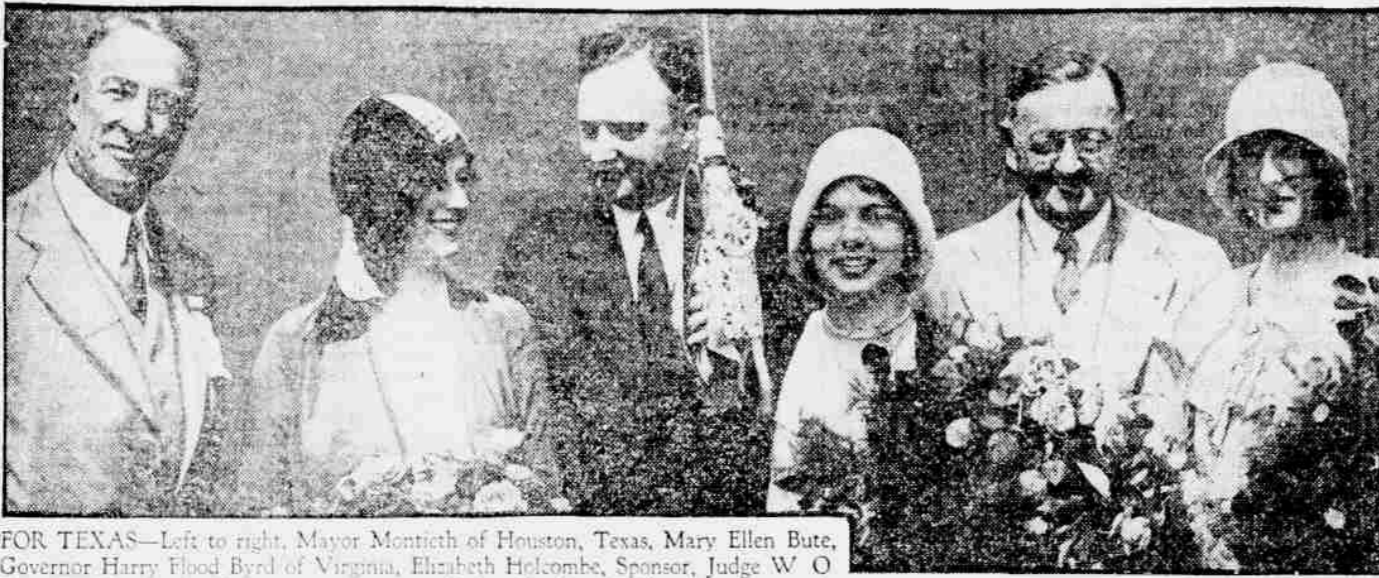


# Herald Cameramen Tell Their Story

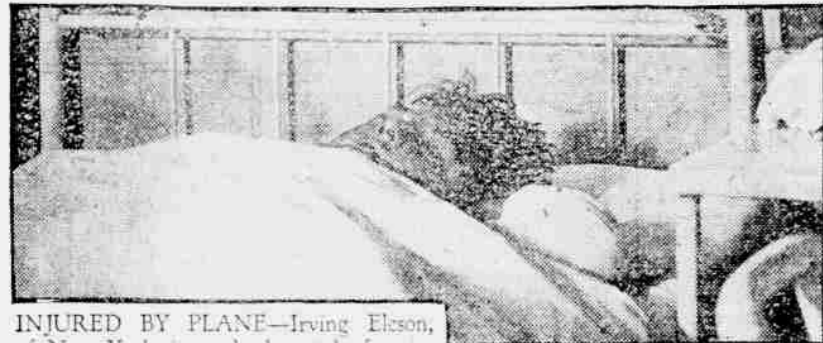

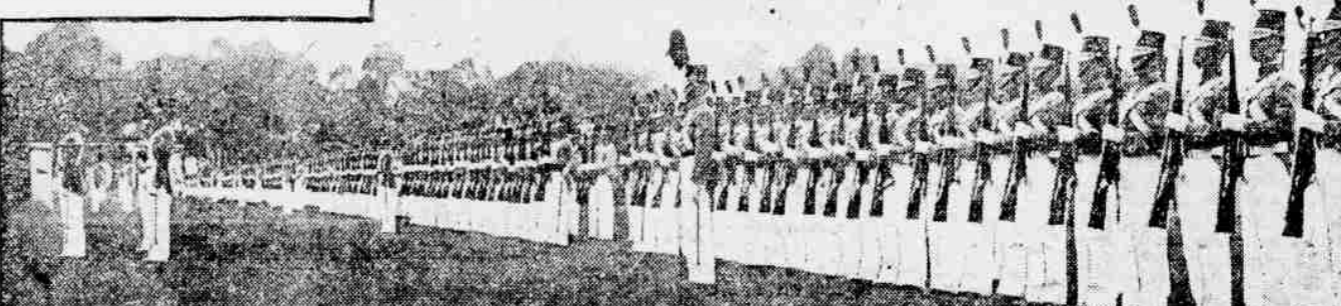

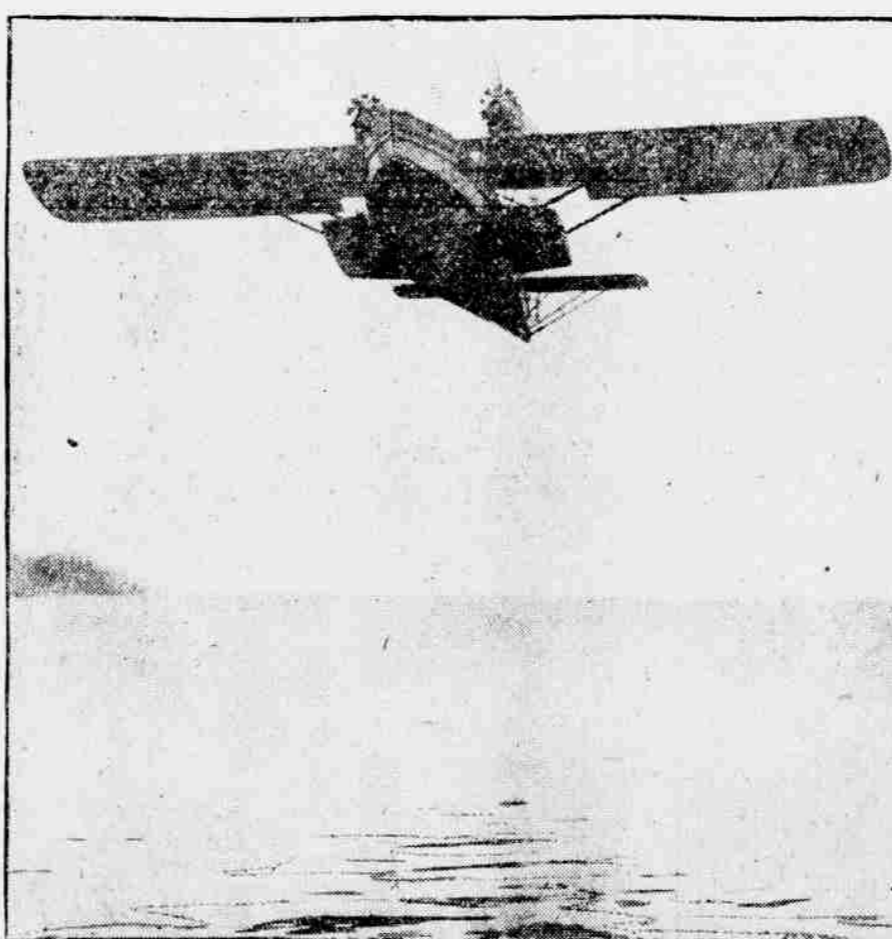

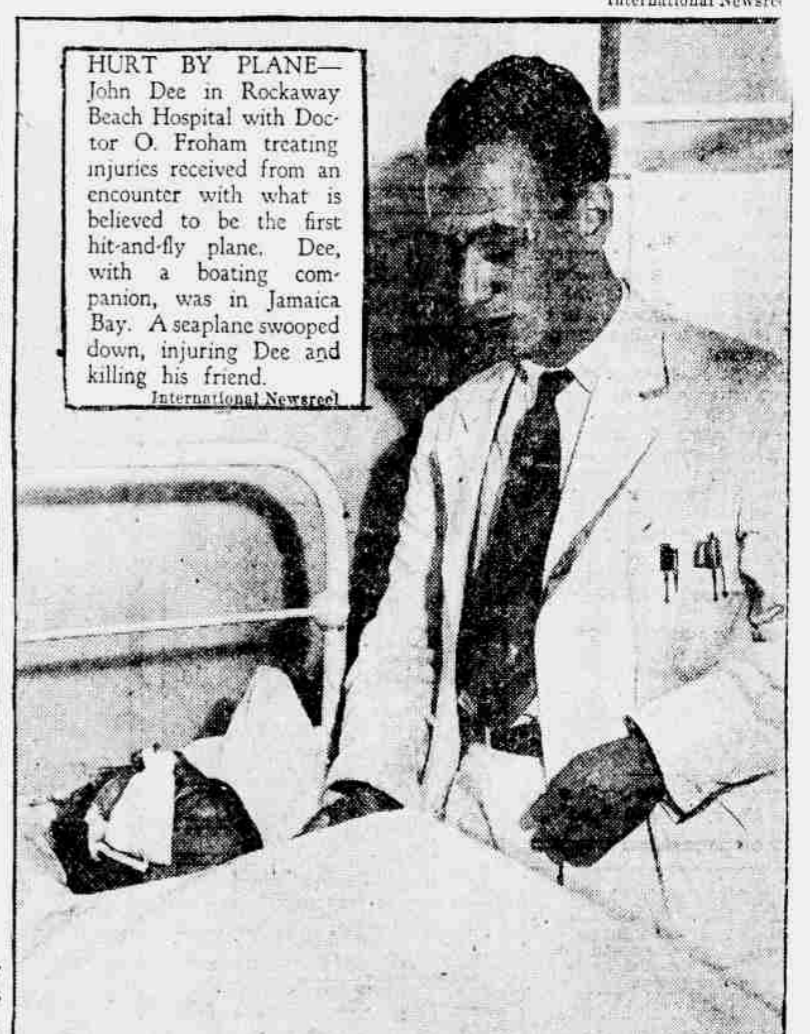
**ANCIENT**—A terra cotta vase discovered at Foix, France, which is now believed to be the original of the Portland vase, famous throughout the world for design and workmanship.
