

PLAN PATRIOTIC MASS MEETING

The Americanization Committee of the Junior Chamber of Commerce has almost completed plans for the patriotic mass meeting, to be held in Bearsey Park on the afternoon of the Fourth of July. Last Friday the committee met with the representatives of various agencies interested in Americanization, and also some of the foreign leaders in the city.
