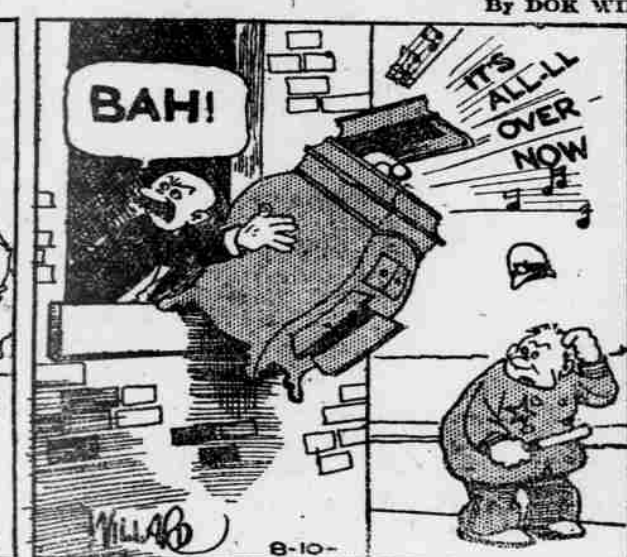

The need for the migration of Italy's excess population is paramount and new fields for her surplus sons and daughters are expected to be found in Argentina and Brazil. At a recent conference of the Italian Colonial Institute, it was pointed out by Professor Giovanni Bonacci that Italy could be supplied with both coals and petroleum from Brazil and Argentina.
