

DESCENDANTS OF FAMOUS OUTLAW IN DAMAGE SUIT

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 9. (U.P.)—Legal complaints were substituted for firearms today when descendants of Jesse James, America's most legendary bandit, appeared in court to press their claims to \$80,400 damages from a motion picture company.

Miss Jessie Estelle James, granddaughter of the noted Missouri bandit, said she left a fiancé and a job in Kansas City to come to Hollywood at the behest of the Paramount-Famous-Lasky Corporation. She sought redress of \$71,000 on the grounds that she contracted to portray the role of her grandmother, Mrs. Zerelda Samuels, in a picture but that another actress was given the part.

Jesse E. James, only son of the bandit, asked for \$9,400 on his assertion that he was to aid in publicity work for the picture and received only \$600. He thought \$10,000 a reasonable sum.

A jury of six men and six women, selected because they confessed ignorance to the exploits of the original James, will hear the suit.

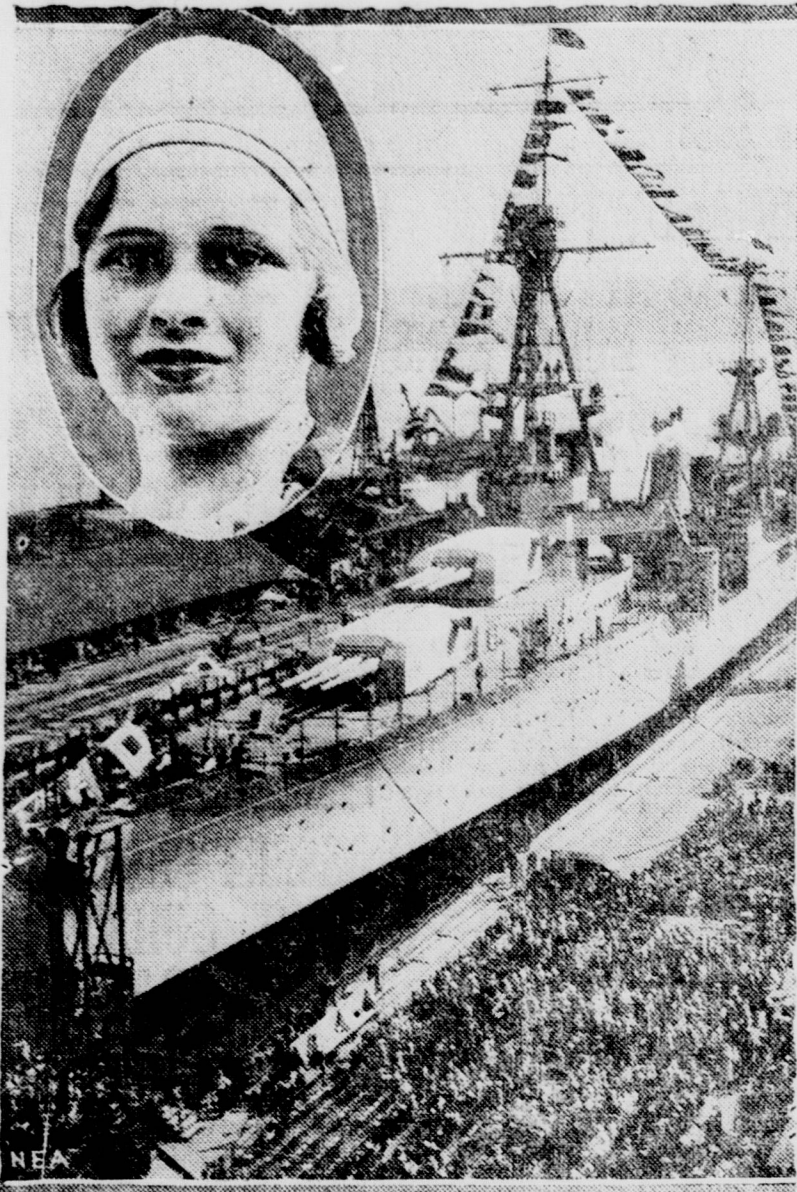

The Louisville is fifth of the eight Washington treaty cruisers. The ship will have a speed of 37 miles an hour, carry 38 officers and 682 men, with nine 8-inch guns in her main battery.

JUDGE FINNEY TO RESCUE OF HARASSED COP

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 9. (U.P.)—Policeman Frank U. Gosselin breathed somewhat easier today, for he had written promise of a judge that his wife, a former lion tamer and circus bareback rider, will not molest him any more.

Judge A. C. Finney issued an "anti-molest" order against Mrs. Bessie Gosselin after the traffic patrolman recounted some of his experiences at the hands of his helpmeet.

"She's not afraid of policemen, Judge," the harassed husband said. "I was directing traffic one day and she came right into the street and slapped my face."

"I called a patrol wagon but my buddies took one look at her and decided they wouldn't make any arrests."

The Gosselins have had trouble since the wife alleged \$2,400 in community property mysteriously vanished.

Judge Finney is the senior judge of the superior court of Imperial county, who has been on the bench in Los Angeles during the summer months.

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 9. (U.P.)—Mrs. Lucille Bailey, 23, was held in the county psychopathic ward today after allegedly confessing that she shot her husband and then turned the gun on herself when she became jealous of his attentions to another woman.

The husband, Francis X. Bailey, 30, an insurance broker, was reported in a critical condition from an operation in which a bullet was removed from underneath his heart.

He told police that bandits committed the shooting and continued to deny his wife's connection with the affair after he was informed of her signed statement. Neighbors said they heard the couple quarrel.

M'Adoo Declares He Is Through

SAN LUIS OBISPO, Calif., Sept. 9. (U.P.)—William G. McAdoo, wartime secretary of the treasury, today set at rest rumors he was considering a race for governor of California by announcing he has left politics for good.

"I am satisfied to practice law and will not be a candidate," the former cabinet member and son-in-law of former President Wilson declared.

McAdoo had been mentioned in prohibition circles as a possible independent candidate against Mayor James Rolph, Jr., of San Francisco, the Republican nominee, who was not regarded as a staunch supporter of the 18th amendment.
