Prisons for Women

TWO NOTED SUCH IN PARIS TO BE PULLED DOWN—THE INMATES. Two ancient and curious institutions, visited by all strangers who make a study of the treatment of criminals, are about to disappear.

The prison of the Faubourg St. Denis is very ancient, but was not until the year 1810 the eleventh century it was a hospital for lepers. Odon says it was then a famous establishment, and that Louis le Gros stopped there on his way to St. Denis to take the royal banner.

The prison of Sainte Pelagie, an institution of another order, was first used as an asylum for repentant women, founded by Mme. de Beauharnais. For many years it was used by the public to shut up vicious women, fathers sending unmanageable daughters there, and husbands intractable wives.

The cause of the destruction of these historical institutions is the change in our penitentiary system. It has been found that the system of keeping female prisoners together will not do. Although somewhat of a novelty, it has means for communicating with each other, and for acts that cannot be described, and the young who go in with a single crime upon their heads, but who are the result of thoughtlessness, perhaps invariably come out abandoned and hardened criminals.

Evidently there is something wrong when this is the case, and specialists set to work to find it out. From these results result what is here called the cellular system. The women are kept in separate rooms, occupied with work, and are daily occupied to attend to their own needs.
