The Goloid Metric Dollar.

WASHINGTON, December 20.—At the request of Mr. Stephens, chairman of the coinge committee, Dr. W. W. Hubbell has banded to that committee a number of specimens of the goloid metric dollar, which were received this morning from the Philadelphan mint. This dollar contains 75 centigrammes of pure gold and 21 grammes and 75 milogrammes of pure silver and 1 gramme 425 milogrammes of pure copper. It weighs 14½ grammes, which is little less than 220 grams. In size is slightly larger in diameter but not so thick as the half-dollar and is incapable of being split. On the obverse are 13 stars to represent the original states, the words "E pluribus numm" and a finely-cut figure-lead of Liberty and the figures 1878.
