**FIRST TRAIN OVER ELEVATED**  
Change in Chester Postoffice—Other Pennsylvania Notes.  
Chester, July 3.—The first train on the Pennsylvania's new elevated between the eastern section of Chester and the steel bridge over Chester Creek, was run yesterday. It was a local construction train. Passenger traffic is expected to be in operation over the road by the middle of July.  
Lewis G. Monroe, who has been clerk to the Board of Health, of this city, for years, was appointed stamp clerk in the Chester postoffice. His former position will be given to City Clerk Frank W. Harrison.  
The receipts at the Chester postoffice for the last three months have been \$11,392.15, giving a profit to the Government after all expenses have been paid of \$1,002.49. It is a big increase over the corresponding period of last year.
