Next the Assailant, a Negro, Ransacked Her Home and Escaped.

HORRIBLE CRIME IN JERSEY

Miss Florence W. Allison of Moorestown was the Victim.

POSSE SEARCHING FOR CRIMINAL

\$1,500 Offered as a Reward for his Arrest.

William Smith, Who was Arrested Last Night, is Not Believed to be the Perpetrator of the Crime.

Moorestown, N. J., Jan. 19.—Scores of farmers and other citizens of this and neighboring towns are scouring the country in search of the negro who yesterday assaulted and murdered Miss Florence W. Allison in a barn on the farm of the Strawbridge estate.

Miss Allison was assaulted and murdered about noon yesterday. The woman's body bears shocking evidence of the fiendish crime.

The body was not discovered until about 3 o'clock, when Benjamin Funk stopped at the house to deliver oil.

The child told the neighbors and the authorities, who soon reached the scene, that after Miss Allison had been gone from the house a little while a "big black man" came in.

Friends who examined the house discovered that all of Miss Allison's jewelry, including a gold watch and a small sum of money, was stolen.
