Exhibit of Society to be Placed in New Building Shortly
LECTURE COURSE TO EXPLAIN SPECIMENS

Within a short time the removal of the very valuable collection of the Natural History Society of Delaware from Friends' School to the old pumping station at Cool Spring Park will be begun. Shortly thereafter Wilmingtonians will have available the only public natural history museum in the State, it being one of the provisions of the Water Commissioners in granting the society the use of the building and the display should be open to the public.

Only those who know the value of the collection can appreciate the action of the Board of Water Commissioners and the willingness of the Natural History Society to virtually present it to the public. Persons interested in the natural history of Delaware have found the collection invaluable. It has been made during many years, contributions having been sent by the foremost scientific men of the State. The late William M. Canby was one of those most interested in the society and other men of his standing have given it the high status it now enjoys not only in Delaware, but in other States.

It is the purpose of the society to engage an attendant for the building and to take the proper safeguards for the care of the collection. The proximity of the pumping station to the High School will probably make the building the resort of many High School pupils engaged in the studies which the specimens in the collection illustrate. A number of lectures will be given in the building in connection with the exhibit.

Now that the Historical Society has been successful in getting permission to occupy the building, some persons have suggested that the Historical Society be permitted to occupy part of the old pumping station, should there be room. The Historical Society's valuable collection has outgrown the building at Tenth and Market streets, where it is now kept. Mention was made sometime ago of the removal of this collection to the old pumping station at Cool Spring Park, but the matter was never taken up with the Board of Water Commissioners.

R. LEONCAVALLO, FAMOUS COMPOSER OF ITALIAN OPERA



Ruggiero Leoncavallo, the famous composer, whose opera, "I Pagliacci," has been a favorite with music lovers since its first presentation in 1892, was born in Naples, March 8, 1858. Leoncavallo ranks with Puccini and Mascagni as a master of the modern Italian school of music, although, according to some critics, his work gives evidence of German influence. Besides "I Pagliacci," his other operas, especially "La Boheme" and "Zaza," have been well received. In 1906 Leoncavallo visited America and conducted performances of some of his own works.

DORNEY TALKS OF HEALTH WAR

Says Some Soulless Corporations are Responsible For Spread of Disease

"Sad Affair in Hogan's Alley! Snootzenheimer wife and seven children found dead! American Air Company of Wilmington explain that Snootzenheimer had been notified of six months' arrears in air rent, and while the company deeply regret it, they were obliged to shut off the air."

Supposing we found that in our newspapers some day, asked John M. Dorney of the American Federation of Labor and the Painters' Union, in his speech last night at the Tuberculosis Exhibit, on the causes and cure of tuberculosis. He went on to say that the squallid corporations were doing just as bad as this in shutting off decent food, fresh air in working places and sufficient clothing, from people. Physicians say that the causes of tuberculosis are poor food, impure air, deficient vitality, mental depression. What causes them? Decent, Christian, intelligent, ambitious men stood on the corner of Ninth and Market streets this winter and considered suicide because they were out of work; whole families in Wilmington have gone to bed supperless, have slept shivering and walked the streets under the steeples of all the churches; rich bankers have told them to eat rice, when they could not buy eggs, beef, milk; thousands of men have to breathe impure air while they work. Yet doctors say lack of these things is the cause of tuberculosis. Who is to blame? God? No, he made laws all right until some infernal scoundrel of men interfered.

"I would like to be a Czar 30 days and take some of the captains of industry, the hypocrites who sit in the front pews of churches and show them where I work," said Mr. Dorney. "Thousands work in terrible conditions; they don't know how to tell you about them, and they are too tired. I would have been too tired last week to tell you—I went to sleep after breathing ammonia fumes and pulverized wood-fibre all day, wishing I might never wake up again. Some of the remedies? The


