WASHINGTON LETTER.

[From our Special Correspondent.] WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 21, 1878.

If General Sherman has gone, as the "National Republican" thinks, to the Texas border, the act probably means business. It is to be regretted that Conkling's Senate Committee, appointed specially to take charge of our relations with Mexico at a time when, as now, the Administration threatened war, did not make at least a partial report before Congress adjourned.

Various charges, which seem to have some foundation, and which will certainly be investigated, are made in connection with the bill, passed at the last session of Congress, by which the United States general government is made to guarantee the payment of principal and interest of the District Three-hundred-and-five bonds.

If we are to believe that Kearney ever had any commanding position among workmen, we must admit that he seems to have lost it. Whether his own coarseness and lack of method have injured him, or his advocacy of Butler, will be a mystery for a long time.

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
