During a single week nearly one thousand persons have arrived at New York from Europe, as steerage passengers! Large numbers have also arrived at other ports, making in all, probably not less than two thousand. The largest portion are from Great Britain and Ireland; but considerable numbers from Germany and Switzerland. In addition to this, a very large number of the same class of emigrants, are constantly coming into the U. States from Canada, Nova Scotia, and other places. Many of them, though not of the upper class, are yet possessed of some property.
