MUSIC BOOKS Spain Is Preparing To Become Monarchy Again, Franco Says

MADRID, July 18.-Generalissimo Francisco Franco last night proclaimed that he is only acting as head of the Spanish government pending return to a monarchy which would perpetuate Falange ideals and the national syndicalist state.

In a 35-minute speech to members f the Falange National Council Franco said Spain was entering the reparatory period for return of a onarchy, but he did not say when the changeover would be made. He declared the monarchy must guar-antee the "essentials" of the Falange




