Airmail Business Jumps 40 Pct. Under New Rate By the Associated Press

Airmail business jumped 40.68 per cent during the first full month under the new 5-cent rate, the Post Office Department announced yes-

Led by San Francisco, which showed a gain of 82.72 per cent, 28 regional offices reported increases of 1,434,123 pounds in airmail dispatched in October over September when the 8-cent rate was in effect. The increase in Washington was 23.05 per cent.

The department estimated that 212,538,510 pieces of mail were carried by the domestic airlines during October, an increase of almost 61,-500,000 over September. Assistant Postmaster General Gael

Sullivan, who has charge of air postal transport, said: "I feel certain that within a few years we shall more than treble our present airmail loadings."


