The set to be furnished by the Insurance Women's Club will enable the society to teach four youngsters at once in its regular Saturday classes for children between 21/2 and 5 years of age, according to Miss Ruth A. Hudnut, executive director. . Eight youngsters are now enrolled in the classes.
