Local Club to Aid Hearing Society's Work for Children

The Washington Hearing Society's work for preschool children was given a boost this week from the Insurance Women's Club of Washington which has voted to purchase a set of ear phones for the train ear used by the society in the instruction of youngsters with impaired hearing.

The project was approved at a club dinner Monday and the necessary funds were appropriated from the group's recent Christmas party welfare collection.

The train ear, which originally was equipped with one set of ear phones, was donated to the society by the Town Club. Two additional sets have been contributed by the Washington Service Guild.

The set to be furnished by the Insurance Women's Club will enable the society to teach four youngsters at once in its regular Saturday classes for children between 2½ and 5 years of age, according to Miss Ruth A. Hudnut, executive director. Eight youngsters are now enrolled in the classes.

By amplifying sound, the train ear frequently enables children to hear for the first time, Miss Hudnut said.

Aid to the hard of hearing is a national project of the National Association of Insurance Women and the local club has supported the work of the Washington Hearing Society in the past by financing a scholarship to its summer course for preschool children.

Conference Plans
The Insurance Women's Club also is making plans for the entertainment of the annual conference of Region II of the national association to be held March 9-11 at the Mayflower Hotel. Between 100 and 200 delegates are expected to attend from clubs in Maryland, Delaware, Virginia, West Virginia, North Carolina, Kentucky and Tennessee.

The regional director is Mrs. Eleanor B. Smithson, member and past president of the local club, who will preside. Miss Betty P. Gibbon, also a member of the Washington group, is general chairman of the conference.

Another group planning to hold a conference here in the spring is the Eastern Region of the Women's Advertising Clubs of the Advertising Federation of America.

The Women's Advertising Club of Washington will play hostess at the meeting, which is scheduled March 31-April 1 at the Shoreham Hotel.

One of the highlights of the program will be a costume party at which delegates will be dressed to represent a trade mark, a famous person in world affairs, an entertainment star or a character from the comics.

Helen Carroll Corathers, APA vice president and chairman of its Council on Women's Advertising Clubs, will preside at a panel discussion on club problems and activities.

Kay Hanson heads the General Conference Committee, which includes Dorothy Carr, president of the local club; Jane Beam, Bette Doolittle, Violet Dudley and Mary Pauline Perry.
