U.N. Troops Gain On Two Fronts in **Bitter Fighting**

Tanks and Infantry Push 2 Miles With Artillery Support By the Associated Press

U. S. 8th ARMY HEADQUAR-TERS, Korea, Oct. 13. - United Nations infantry supported by tanks and artillery gouged out new gains on the Western and Central Korean fronts today as fighting flared with renewed savagery across Korea.

The United States 24th Division and two South Korean divisions gained up to nearly two miles along a 22-mile front in the center.

Allied artillery pounded a daylong rain of high explosives on Chinese Communists positions above Yonchon in the west. United States 1st Cavalry troopers moved unopposed onto a hill forming the eastern flank of a vital ridgeline scarred by four days of fighting.

One battalion of the cavalry was badly cut up Friday. A captured Red officer on the Eastern front said the North Korean army-the one that started the war 21 months ago-now was "practically non-existant."

Drive Reds Off Peak.

American and French troops on Heartbreak Ridge in Eastern Korea scorched the last Reds out of their suicide bunkers on the slopes of the ridgeline's northernmost peak. The peak, Hill 851, was captured Friday. Allied officers said the mopping up action was among the bitterest fights of the war.
