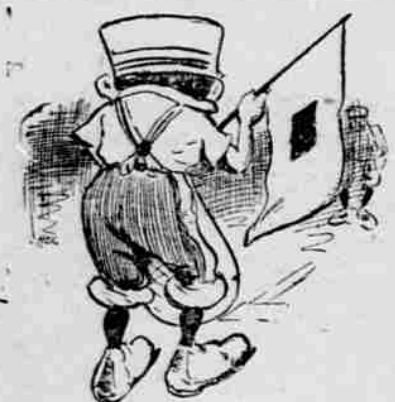


**THE NAVY YARD DEFEATED.**

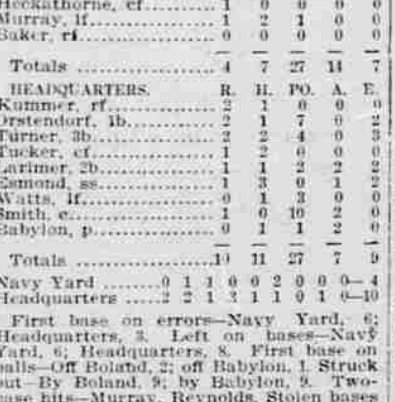
