

RAILROAD SHARES STRONG.

Steel Stocks the Only Weak Point in a Firm Market.

Rumors of Division of Surplus of St. Paul Help the Whole.

Advances in the Steel Stocks.

NEW YORK, Aug. 14.—Today's stock market showed a broadening of interest and a renewal of the steel stocks which characterized the dealings since Monday morning.

The market yesterday was irregular and professional in the extreme. The opening and earlier business of the day was buoyant, the steel stocks being the best in recent days. During the afternoon there was a recession of some importance, so that at the close the greater part of the gains had disappeared.

The outlook is for a continuance of this kind of market for the present. On the recession there will be good buying by the public, but it will be confined to the steel stocks.

All of the so-called specialties were strong, with rapid advances noted in General Electric and Consolidated Gas.

The advance in the steel stocks was significant in many ways, gross earnings for the quarter increasing about 5 per cent for the complete fiscal year.

The surplus, after all charges and dividends, amounted to over \$500,000, as against \$190,000 last year.
