GOOD WORK OF THE LIFE SAVING SERVICE. LOSS OF LIFE GREATLY REDUCED.

Superintendent Kimball Reports This the Banner Year—Urges Better Remuneration for Superintendents. S. J. Kimball, General Superintendent of the Life Saving Service, yesterday afternoon gave out an abstract of his annual report for the past fiscal year.

The statistics show absolutely the smallest loss of life from documented vessels suffering disaster within the scope of the service during these years, and also including the vessels of all classes not included in the undocumented, with the exception of the years 1889, 1892, 1893, and 1898.

The cost of the maintenance of the service is \$1,410,000. The general superintendent inadequately calls attention to the inadequate compensation of district superintendents, whom he believes to be the poorest paid officers under the Government.

COMMISSION FUNDS NEARLY EXHAUSTED. A LARGE DEFICIENCY EXPECTED. The adjudication of Spanish Treaty Claims May Be Delayed—Congress to Be Asked for an Extra Appropriation.

The Spanish Treaty Claims Commission will be without funds before the end of the fiscal year, June 30, 1902, unless Congress comes to its aid with a deficiency appropriation.

EXPANSION OF THE POSTAL SERVICE. INCREASE OF BUSINESS MARKED.

Large Additional Expenditures for the Maintenance of the System—A Building for Supply Division Recommended. William M. Johnson, First Assistant Postmaster General, submitted his annual report for the past fiscal year to the Postmaster General yesterday afternoon.

CIVIL SERVICE FOR RURAL CARRIERS. Spiking of the force of rural carriers and their efficiency, Mr. Johnson says that there is no good reason why they should not have the protection and sense of security which the civil service system throws over incumbents of office in the classified service.

TO ESTABLISH A NEW POSITION. Under the caption "Supervisors of Letter Carriers" Mr. Johnson has the following to say: "To tighten the administrative grasp on the enlarging service, I have the honor to recommend that all the large postoffices, especially those employing as many as fifty letter carriers, be assigned or appointed to have exclusive charge of the letter carrier force; that such officials be designated as supervising letter carriers, and be placed in the free delivery service; also that all present employees, under whatever name or title, who are performing the duties of supervising or directing letter carriers, be transferred to the rolls of the free delivery division."
