Election Not Mirror Of Women's Attitude, Says Suffrage Organ

In a final analysis of the woman vote in the recent elections the National Woman's Party reaches the conclusion that women apparently voted for the same reasons, and were swayed by the same issues as men."

According to the analysis, which is to be published in the forthcoming issue of the Suffragist, information gathered in the crucial States shows that women cast from one-third to one-half of the total vote.

"In local matters," says the analysis, "women supported increased expenditures for school and humane purposes, but did not generally initiate any reforms."

"Women candidates were few and almost invariably unsuccessful, with the exception of a few women elected to State legislature or minor county offices."

When it was pointed out to Alice Paul today that the conclusions reached are similar to those published by the National Association Opposed to Woman Suffrage, she said: "We contend that the election did not reflect the attitude of the women on the issues in the campaign, since they had no voice in making them, and had no time to organize for independent action. Until the woman vote acts as an organized force it cannot be clearly interpreted."

According to Elinor Taylor Marsh, assistant editor of the Suffragist, who wrote the analysis, in many localities the women organized for independent action and did effective work in county and State elections.

The analysis touching on the vote in Maine says approximately 50,000 women voted in that State.

"The League of Nations was the issue which resulted in the Republican victory in Maine, but women were not a deciding factor," it declares.

According to the information gathered in West Virginia, approximately 200,000 women, or 75 per cent of the women registered, went to the polls. The estimate from Louisiana is


that 42 per cent of the women eligible to vote cast their ballots. In South Dakota it is estimated that women cast about 40 per cent of the total vote. In Vermont, according to the analysis, 32.5 per cent of the women registered and of these from 75 to 85 per cent voted.

No estimate of the woman vote in New Jersey is given, but, according to the analysis, the women there "proved strongly opposed to the League of Nations, and this opposi-

tion led to the landslide which resulted in the defeat of the Democratic boss of Essex county, Jim Nugent, known as the enemy of women."

To illustrate what the woman vote may accomplish as an organized force, the analysis cites the election of Nathan Straus, Jr., Democrat, to the New York State Senate, from a strong Republican district.
