RAISED AN EAGLE'S NEST. Queer Find Made in It by Three Washingtonians. SNAKE AND DECOY DUCKS.

Three of the Wooden Fowls Had Been Carried Off by the Parent Birds—Nest Was Seventy-five Feet Up in a Tree and a Live Hacksaw Fought the Adventurous Intruders.

BUILT HIGH IN THE AIR. The tree in the top of which was the nest is one of the giants of the Virginia coast.
