

IRISH LEADER BELIEVED TO BE INSANE—LONG IN SERVICE OF NATION.

In the Putumayo rubber fields. As a result of his report, a British royal commission headed by him investigated the situation and brought about reforms in the treatment of men employed in the industry.

Born in Ireland in September, 1866, he passed his youth in obscurity, but early showed an aptitude for diplomatic service. Beginning in 1886, he was successively consul at Corozo, Maricao and for the Portuguese possessions in West Africa south of the Gulf of Guinea.

His work in suppressing atrocities in the Congo and in the Putumayo district in Peru constitute the brightest chapters in his career. At the risk of his life he ended the brutal practice of securing natives employed in the rubber trade, and for this he received the commendation of the entire civilized world.

Visited United States. Sir Roger was in the United States in the summer of 1914, a few weeks before the European war began. He made speeches in many cities for home rule in Ireland. Then he suddenly assumed the role of leader in a movement which had been started in Ireland a few months before to organize an Irish national volunteer force to uphold the authority of the crown and government of Ireland.

Promised by Berlin. Berlin told the world Sir Roger had gone to the German foreign office with the plan that if Germany triumphed over Great Britain, the Green Isle would be devastated by invading Germans. The acting secretary of the foreign office, by order of the imperial chancellor, was represented at the Berlin conference that the German government utterly repudiated the intentions attributed to it.

Conan Doyle's Defense. Sir Arthur Conan Doyle took this view, and sent an open letter to the British press, saying: "That he should, in the full possession of his senses, act as a traitor to the nation which he has employed and honored, is inconceivable to any one who knew him."

To Irish Soldiers. Sir Roger was called upon to do some missionary work with Irish soldiers who had been taken prisoner by the Germans. A first-hand narrative of one such attempt was forwarded given by Private William Dooley, of the Royal Irish Regiment. He related that Irish prisoners were collected together from the various camps and sent to a body of 2,000. These were treated with plenty of food and soft words until they were considered ripe for the persuasions of the German officers.

Relations With Gaffney. Dispatches on September 26, 1915, told exclusively the reason for the intense interest in the revelations of the secret correspondence conducted by Sir Roger with Gaffney, American consul at Munich, Germany, through the medium of the Austrian government. They set forth the details of the Gaffney case, which had been entangled in Munich by Sir Roger. The disclosure caused a great clamor in the United States and in America and at allied capitals.
