

DEMOCRATS HERE PLAN TO MARCH IN INAUGURAL PARADE

Question of Permanent Headquarters in Capital Discussed by Club.

Celebration in honor of the recent Democratic victory will be held by members of the East Washington Democratic Club this evening at 200 Second street, when plans will be made for organizing marching clubs to take part in the inaugural parade next March. At a meeting of members of the Young Men's Democratic Club last night plans for appearing in the inaugural parade next spring were discussed. Considerable discussion was held over the suggestion that work be commenced now for the next Presidential campaign in 1916. The matter of maintaining a permanent headquarters here in the city was also taken up. William McK. Clifton, secretary of the club, pointed out the advantages which would accrue to the Democrats by their establishing headquarters here, and said he believed other parties would follow the example set by the Democrats. Chairman McK. Clifton was said to be in favor of the project. The dress of members of the club for the inaugural parade, as decided upon tentatively last night, will be silk hats, dark coats, light trousers, and walking sticks.

CARRIERS' CANVASS SHOWS CAPITAL HAS 78,172 DWELLINGS

Average of Three to Family, Not Counting Bachelors and Boarders.

In a population of probably 3 per cent more than 331,000 (the figures of the 1910 census), there are 78,172 dwellings in Washington. This includes houses, flats, and apartments, not quite all of them occupied. This gives in Washington an average of about three persons to the family, excepting a host of bachelor maids and bachelor men, who make their homes with brothers, sisters, and parents. A vast army of boarders are also excepted. The count of habitations was made by the city letter carriers, who were instructed to compile a list of all possible stops on their final routes. The figures are just in. In addition to the habitations, there are 6,201 offices where mail is delivered daily. The count was made to determine an approximate maximum of stops to be made by a letter carrier on his route. This information will be of use in making assignments of carriers to handle the vast crush of Christmas mail.

Season of Exhibition Drills Will Be Opened on Friday, November 29.

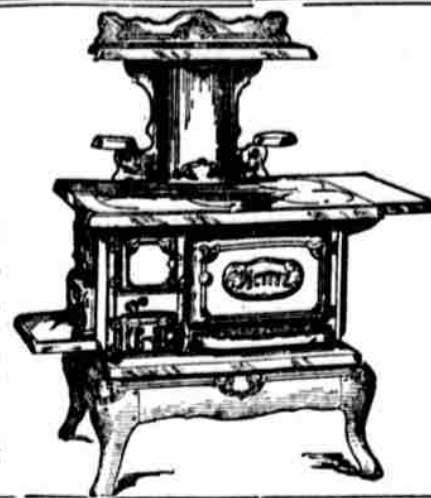

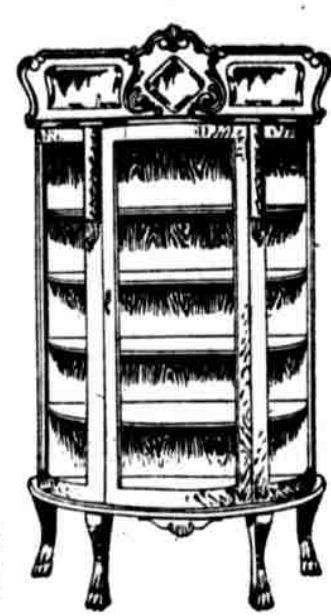
