

THE APPROPRIATION BILL.

Further consideration of the Annual Estimate by the Council.

The Council met again yesterday evening, Ald. McAvoy in the chair. Present, Alderman Richardson, Dixon, Warren, McGinnis, McAvoy, Eldred, Tracy, Schmitt, Colleton, Mc Clowry, Bailey, Powell, O'Brien, Bond, Clark, Kohob, Heath, Sherwood, Moore, Cleveland, Quirk, McGrath, Eichardt, Stuart, Harin, Longshore, Schaffner, Garmy, Cannon, Woodman, and others.

The Council considered the appropriation bill, and furnished the various salary items for the Fire Department, leaving them unchanged except that instead of sixteen janitors at \$480 each, provision is made for twenty-one at \$720 each.

The next increase was by putting in \$4,000 for the erection of an engine-house on the lots to be bought near the corner of Halsted and Thirty-fifth streets.

A motion was made to put in the sum of \$24,000 for the purchase of a lot near the corner of Lincoln and Indiana streets, for the erection of an engine house, pump, hose, and other appurtenances.

The motion was agreed to, and the appropriation bill was passed, and the bill for the erection of an engine-house on the lots to be bought near the corner of Halsted and Thirty-fifth streets.

When the Health Department estimate was reached, the salary of the Sanitary Superintendent was struck out, but when the Council found it had no authority in the matter, it reconsidered its action, and, after trying to strike out the salary of the Health Officer, passed the whole subject, and called for a copy of the contract for the removal of dead animals, it being insinuated that there was something wrong with that contract.

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AN IMPORTANT RAILROAD DECISION.

Judge Drummond, of the United States Circuit Court, at St. Louis, has rendered a decision in the case of the Chicago and North Western Railroad Company against the Chicago and North Western Railroad Company.
