Facts Pointing to a Near Relation as the Murderer.

A Prominent Merchant of Cincinnati Attacked on the Highway.

He Is Badly Wounded and Robbed of All His Valuables.

BELEVILLE, Ill., March 21.—Yesterday evening the citizens of Centerville, this county, were shocked by the news that a horrible murder had been perpetrated a few miles south of that town, on the Saxon road, upon a family by the name of Stetsenreide.

It was immediately reported that the murdered man had been brutally murdered.

He immediately went to Centerville to make known his discovery, upon which Constable Sargent, Sheriff, and other officers of the county, who proceeded to the place of the homicide.

THE STETSENREIDE FAMILY consisted of five persons: Mr. Stetsenreide, Sr., 75 years old; his wife, Mrs. Stetsenreide, 65 years old; his wife, and two children, respectively 3 years and 8 months old.

The house which the murdered family occupied consisted of three rooms, the front room occupied by young Stetsenreide and his family. The adjoining room was occupied by the old gentleman. The murder was evidently committed on Thursday night.

THE BODY OF YOUNG STETSENREIDE was found in the room with the sleeping room with the throat cut and skull split open with an axe. His hands were found in his pockets, as if he had been severely cut with a knife. The wife was killed in bed while asleep.
