

U. S. TO HANDLE ALL SUGAR SALES

Every pound of sugar held by refiners, beet or cane sugar producers, either in stock or in transit, on a certain date to be announced later, will be bought by the United States Government and then sold back to the original holders at the price of the new crop.

The consumer, however, will have to pay an additional cent a pound, perhaps a little more, but the profits of the transaction, instead of going to the refiners, will be absorbed by the Government. The United States equalization board will control the transfer.

PASSENGER AUTO OUTPUT AGAIN CUT

For the last half of 1918 no manufacturer of passenger automobiles is to produce more than 25 per cent of the output of such cars made by him in the entire year 1917.

Concerning the production of passenger cars after December 31, 1918, no decision has been reached, but the Government has warned the manufacturers, representing an investment of roundly \$1,000,000,000, that they may expect to be placed on a 100 per cent war basis after that date.

The decision to cut manufacture for the last half of 1918 to 25 per cent of the 1917 production was reached when Bernard M. Baruch, as chairman of the War Industries Board, and representatives of its various divisions reached a satisfactory conclusion of their negotiations with representatives of the automobile industry concerning the curtailment to be effected in production of passenger cars.

U. S. AND SPAIN ARRANGING LOAN

MADRID, Aug. 26.—Negotiations are under way looking to a commercial loan of approximately 500,000,000 pesetas between Spain and the United States, according to announcement in the newspaper El Liberal. The signatures of American firms exporting cotton to Spain will be given as a guarantee.

COURT DISMISSES LUSITANIA SUITS

NEW YORK, Aug. 26.—Suits aggregating \$4,000,000 and growing out of the sinking of the Lusitania by a German torpedo have been dismissed by Federal Judge Julius M. Mayer, who holds that the cause of the sinking was the illegal act of the imperial German government. Germany is responsible both in the legal as well as the moral sense, he said.

HUNGARY EXPELS JEWS

AMSTERDAM, Aug. 26.—Jews have been rounded up by the government in parts of Hungary, according to a Budapest report to the Jewish correspondence bureau. Streets were barricaded and Jews dragged to prisons. These measures especially were directed against Jews in Galicia, from whom large sums of money were taken by the police as a special tax, and which the Jews were escorted to the frontier.

AIR RAID KILLS 60

ROTTERDAM, Aug. 26.—Sixty persons are reported dead and 134 injured as a result of the latest air raid on Cologne. Bombs fell on a large public building, causing sixty deaths. When a big hotel was struck 134 persons were injured.

DOUBTS ATROCITY STORY

General March, chief of staff, said today that he had never heard of any such case as that reported by Dr. P. H. Howard to the effect that Sergeant A. E. Cole, of East Liverpool, Ohio, was crucified in the Marne fighting. He added that General Pershing would have made a special report of that sort of a case.
