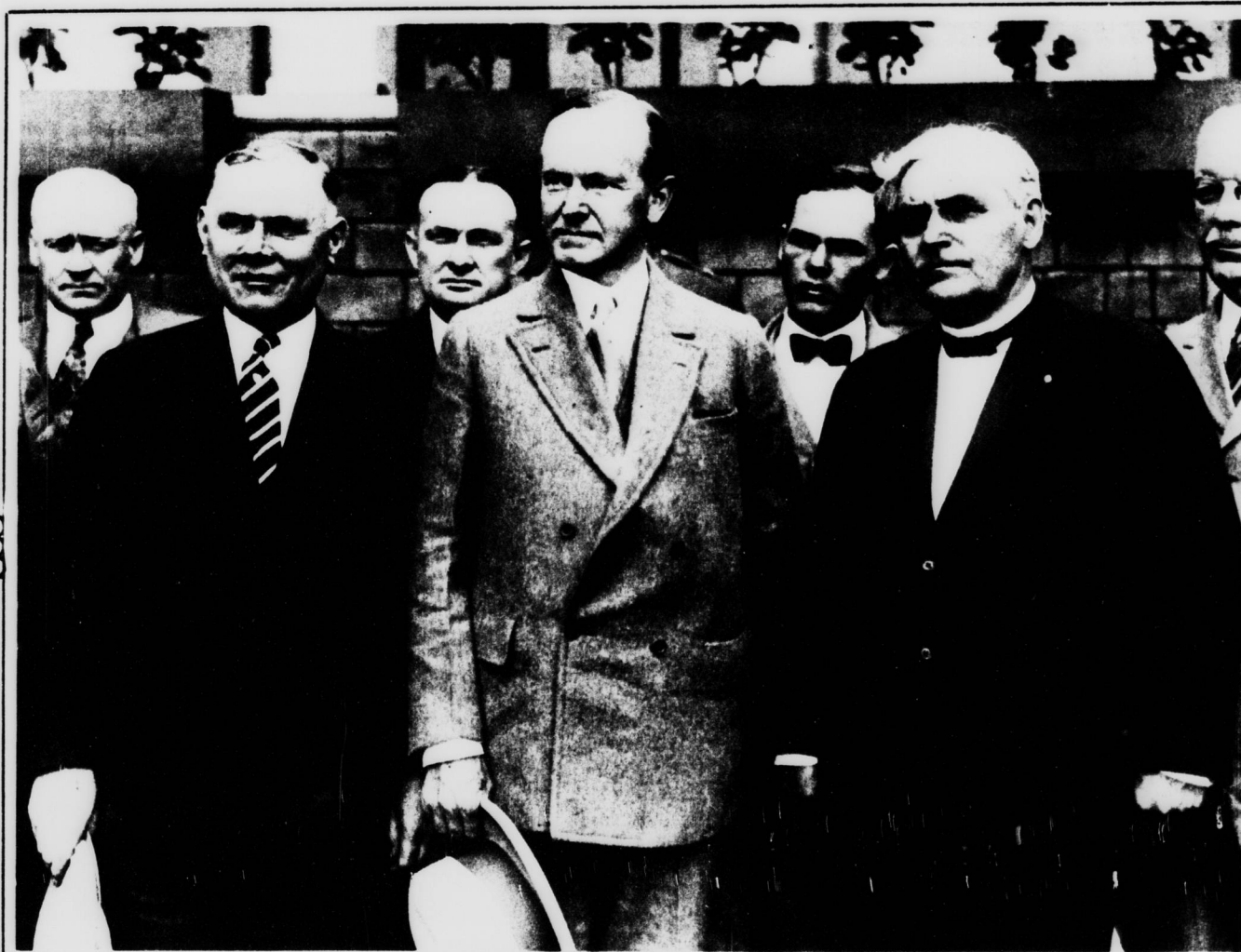

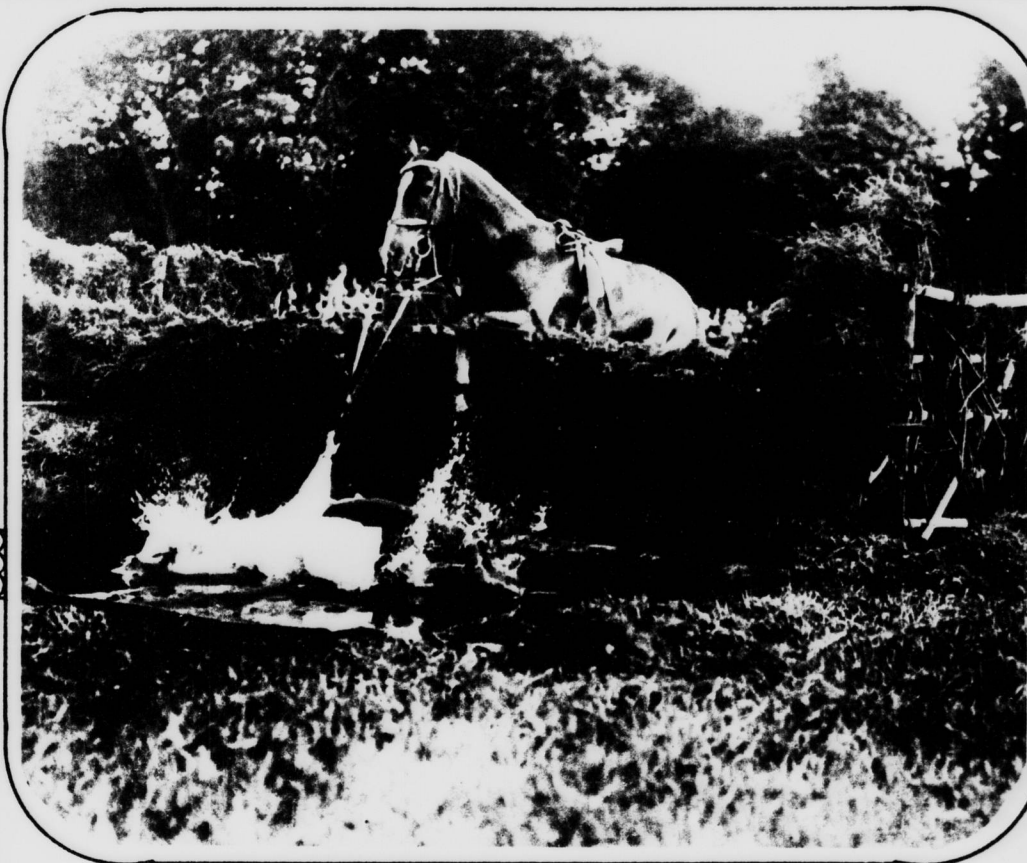

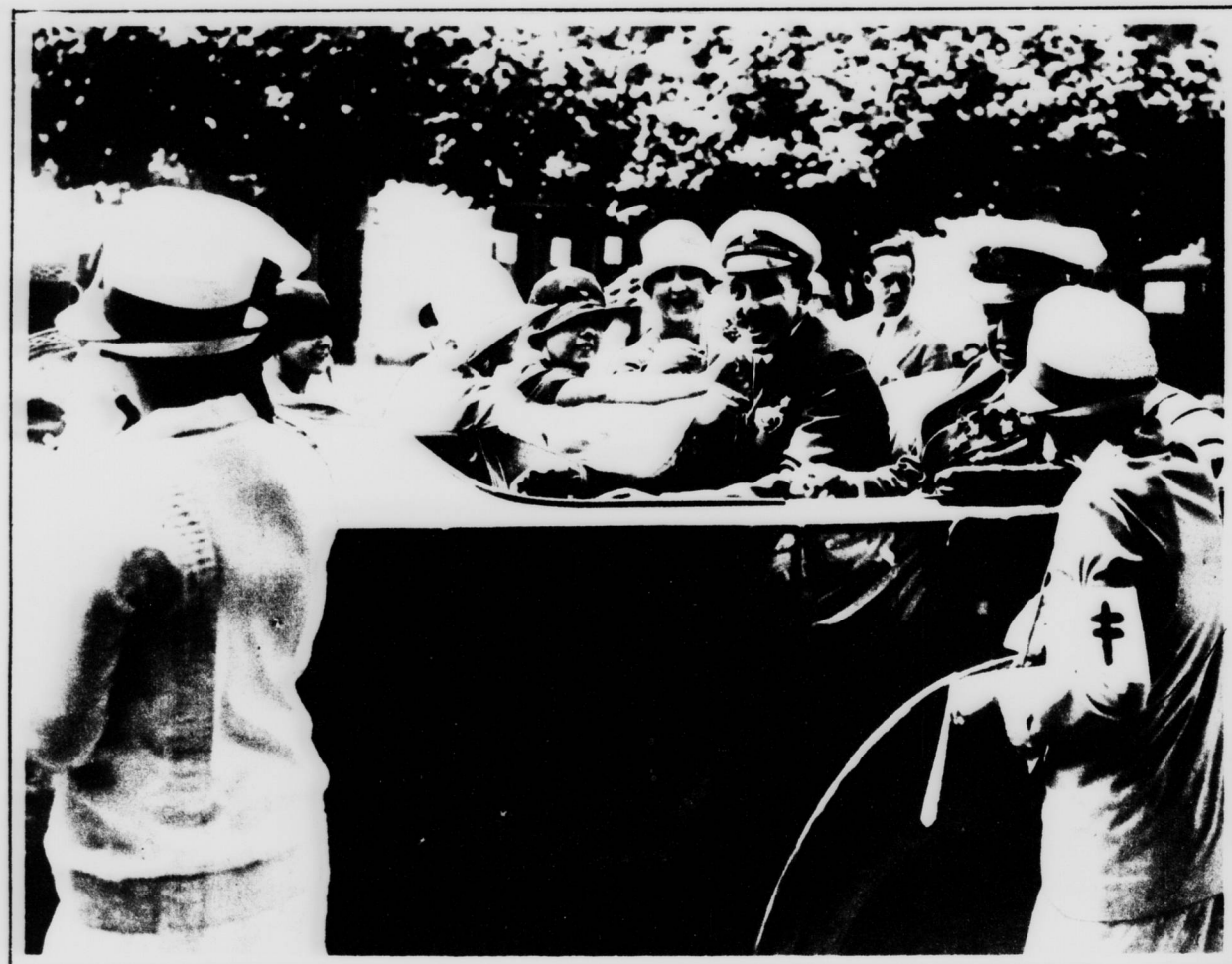


It seems the Atlantic City beauty "Miss America" this year. The pageant are, left to right, Miss Beryl Phier (Miss America of last year) and Miss America.



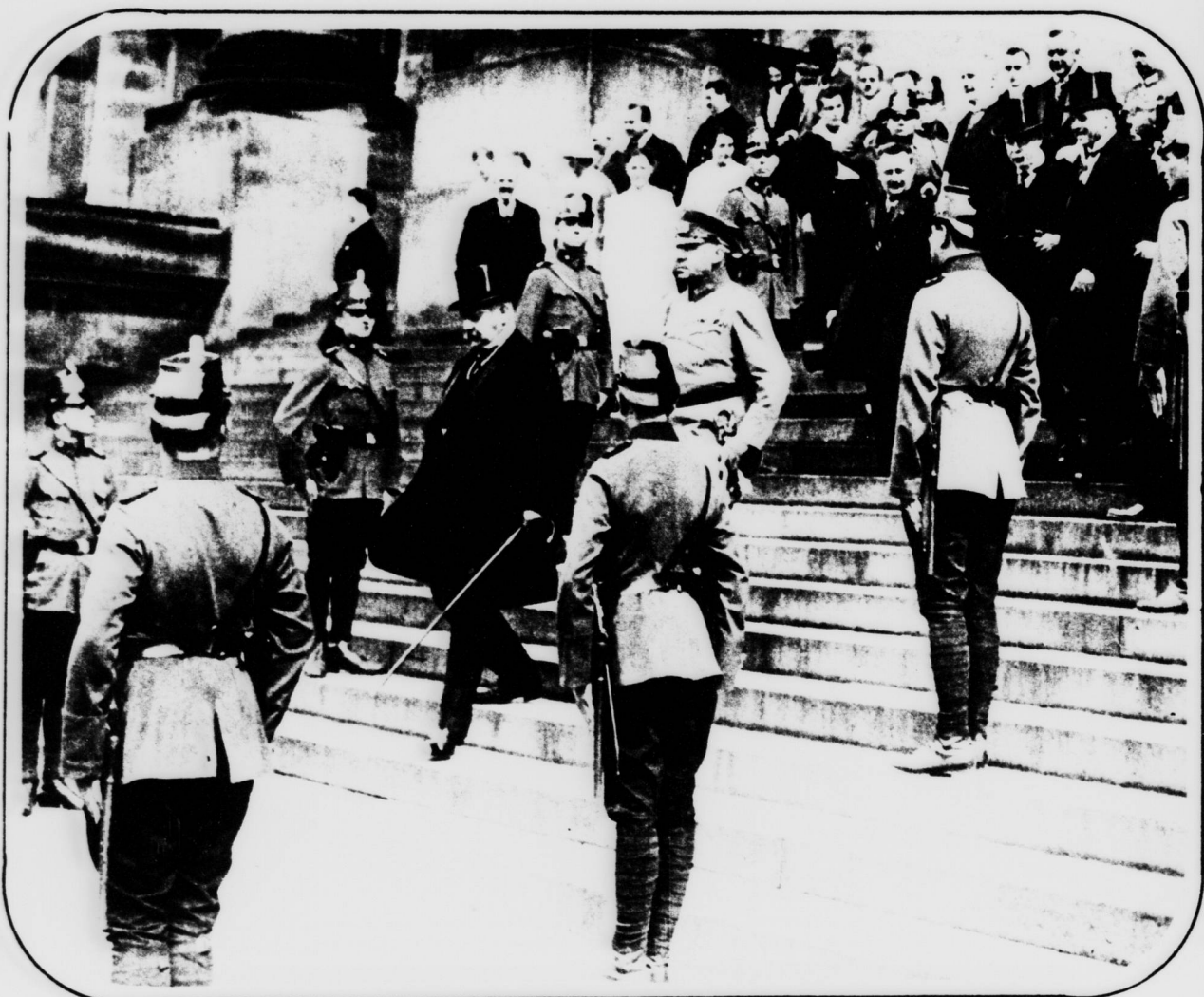
Mrs. J. M. Magee, English horsewoman, took a particularly untimely spill when her horse, Nugget, balked on a jump at a recent meet at Bray, England.

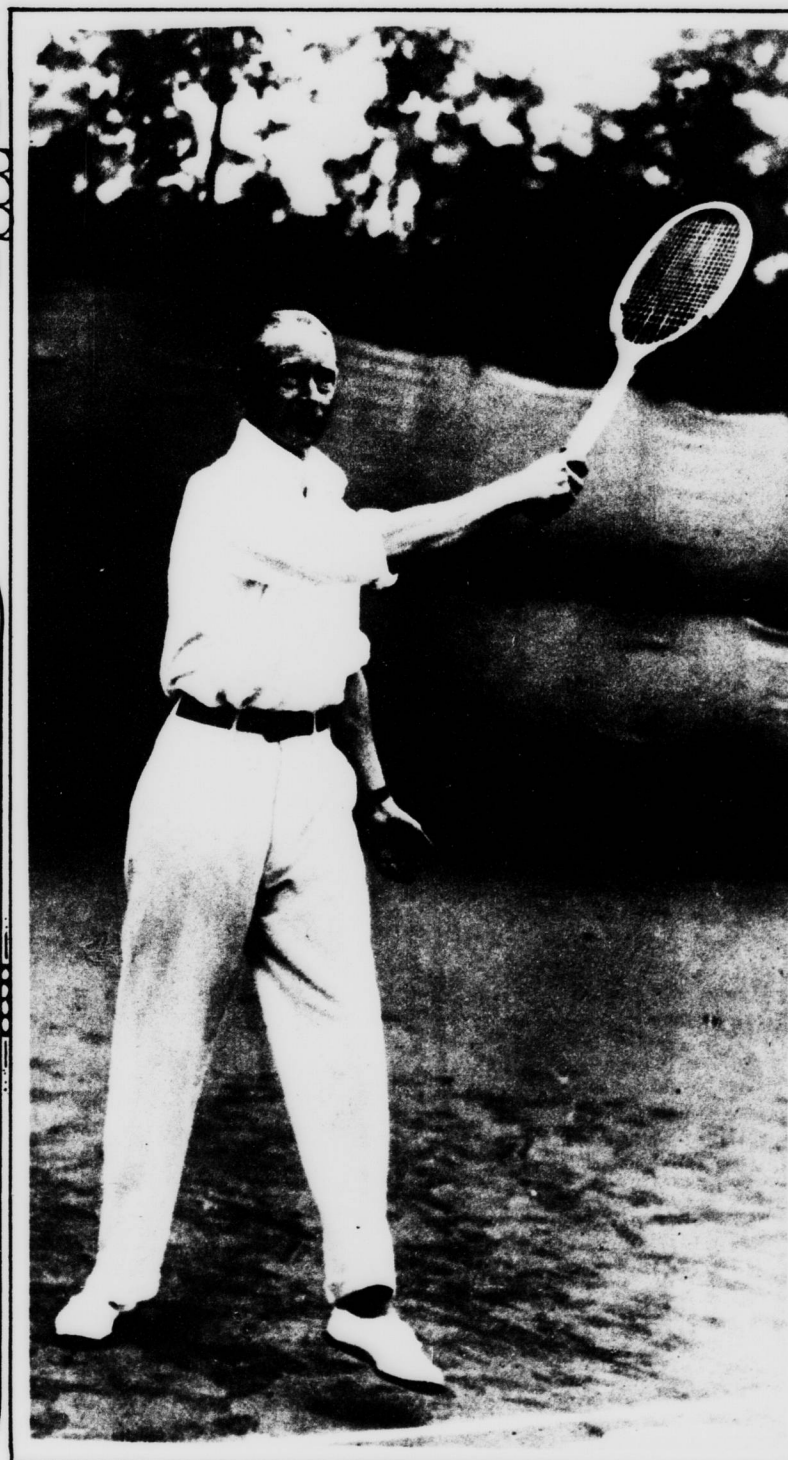
