



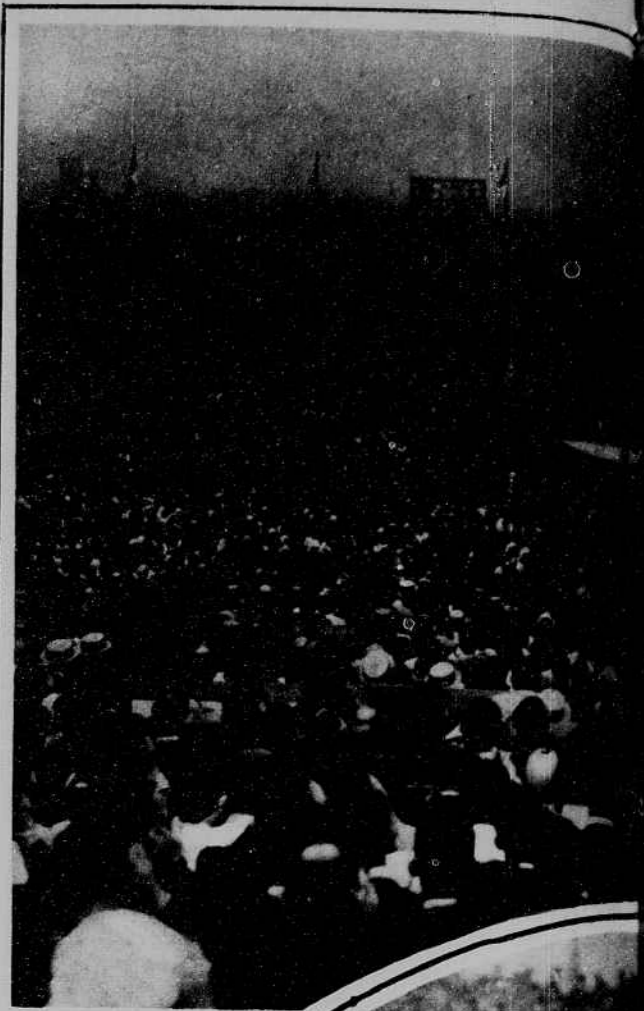

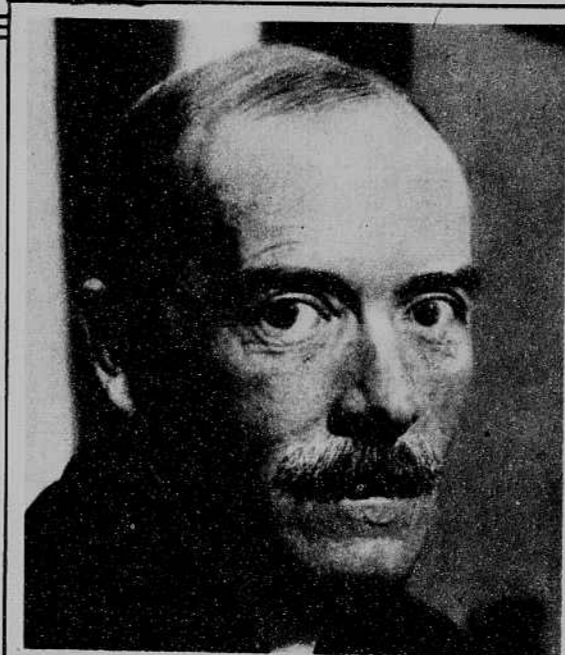


A GENERAL VIEW OF THE ARENA WITH A RECORD CROWD OF OVER 90,000



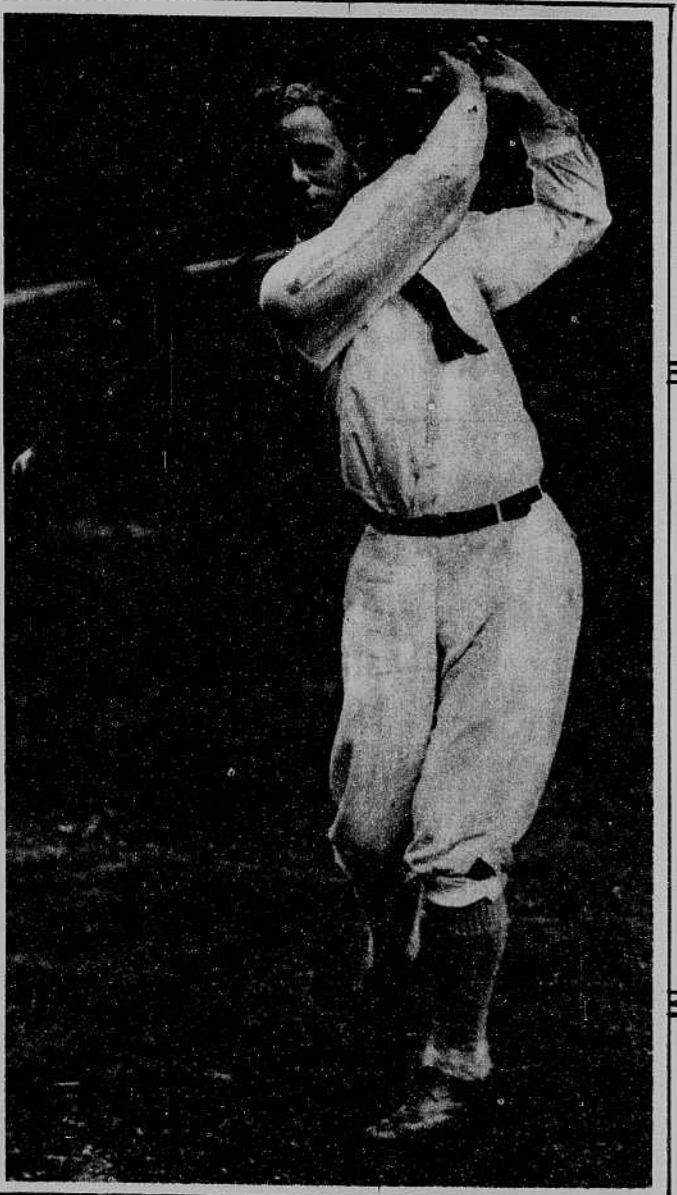

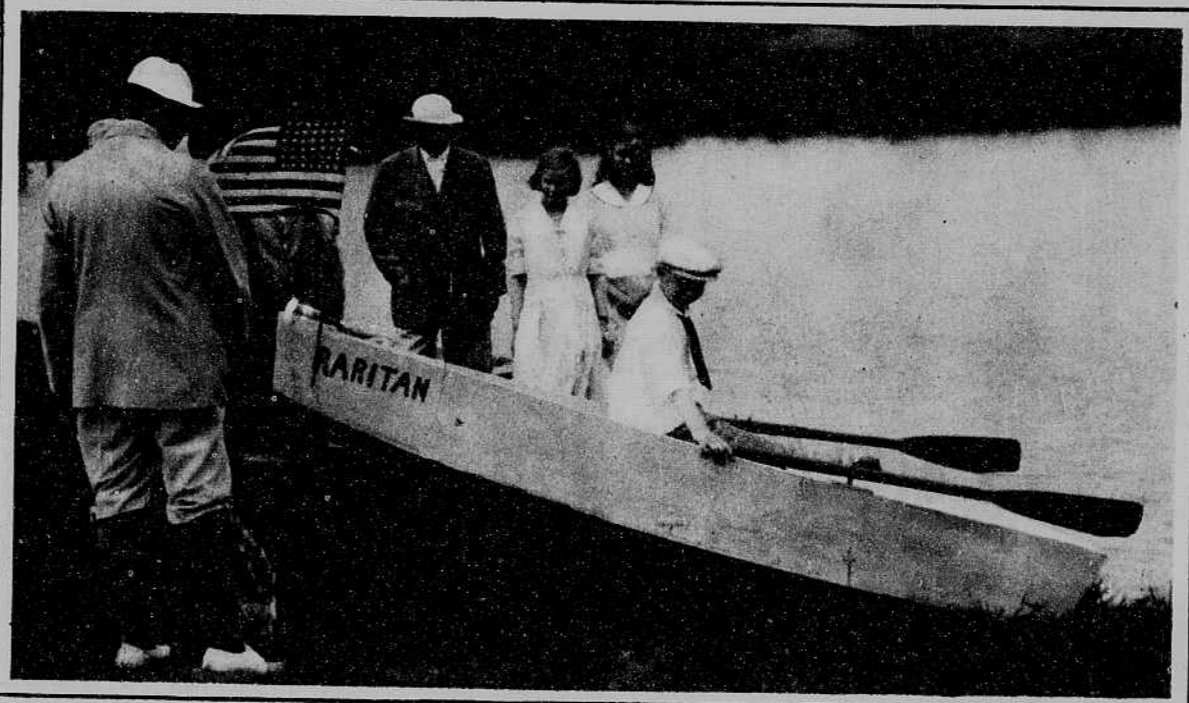
