# **Episcopalians** Indorse Ideal Of Integration

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va., May 27 (P).—The principle of racial integration in church life has been indorsed by the annual convention of the Episcopal Diocese

of Virginia.

The delegates climaxed a spirited debate here yesterday by adopting this resolution:

"It is the principle of the Christian ethic for the people of the characteristics." this diocese that they make every effort in Christian love to eliminate all barriers preventing the free fellowship in the church's life of people of dif-

church's life of people of dif-ferent races."

Whereas the approved reso-lution read "the principle of the Christian ethic," an earlier resolution, later revised, read "the will of God. . . ."

During the debate, the Rev-Rufus J. Womble of Richmond told delegates, "The truth is, we are not willing to have whites and Negroes together in our church on Sunday morning . . . All these recommendations dodge the issue."

The solution to the segrega-tion problem for the churches, he added was "small meetings . . . where we can get to know our brothers in Christ on a basis of real honesty, not high-solution, words"

The question was raised whether the resolution meant that Episcopal churches "must" admit Negroes. Archibald G. Robertson of Richmond replied that every minister "has the right, duty and obligation to admit any one who seeks ad-mission, regardless of distinc-tion."

The delegates, totaling some 250 laymen and ministers, approved a report of the diocese's inter-racial commission which called it "the responsibility and opportunity of each local church to create the attitude essential to carrying out" the Supreme Court decision denouncing segregation as unconstitutional in the public schools.

"We must champion the rights of the minority and defend the dignity of all men," the report added.

If you face this dilemna, the Veterans Administration offers help through its free vocational counseling offices. They're lo-cated on most campuses around the country.

To take advantage of the

counseling, all you have to do is ask for it when you apply for your GI education. It may include personal counseling by an advisor or a series of tests or both. You can decide on the type you want after the VA calls you in to discuss the counseling. Once you finish the counsel-

ing there's nothing to force you ing there's nothing to force you to follow the advice given. It's merely a scientific way to help you make up your own mind about what's best for you on the basis of what the tests and in-

Just how can tests help you decide what kind of a college program you should take?

The VA tests are designed to show whether you have mechanical aptitude, writing or journalical aptitude, writing or journal-istic potential, artistic leanings and all sorts of other individual potentialities. In other words, they're set up to give you an idea of the fields in which you have potential and what fields of endeavor you should steer

The tests can also help you if you have a preconceived opinion of your potential, but have nothing but suspicion to back up

your opinion. Suppose, for example, you believe you would be good in law. You were on the debating team in high school. You have long been able to express yourself well on your feet. You were a clerk in the legal section of the Army and liked the work. Your father is a lawyer. The VA test will show whether you have a potential in this field. Suppose the tests show that you have little aptitude for the study of law. When the test results clash with your opinion you ought to take a second look at whether the law is your meat. There's no use kidding yourself.

The personal counseling sup-

plements the test information by letting you know about labor conditions in various fields, about industrial and business about industrial and business organizations and about various types of occupations in which the demand is heavy

It's also designed to give the counselor a chance to know you and your personality, your edu-cational records, your personal interests and your prior work experience.

Once the counselor starts his interviews with you, you should not try to hide or distort any in-formation about yourself. The counselor, to be most effective, must have your complete confi-

What you tell the counselor is what you tell the counselor is kept in confidence and not di-vulged outside the office, with-out your permission. This kind of an arrangement should make it much easier for you to be

completely frank. completely frank.
