

INFLUENZA KILLS 28 HERE IN DAY

Twenty-eight deaths as a result of the Spanish influenza here were reported to the District Health Department during the twenty-four hours ending at noon today. This is a decrease of six deaths over the twenty-four hours ending at noon yesterday.

One hundred and fifty-nine new cases of the influenza were reported during the twenty-four hours ending at noon today. This is a decrease of 266 new cases in comparison with the 325 new cases reported during the twenty-four hours ending at noon yesterday.

While I do not think the epidemic is increasing, I think that it will probably be impossible to open theaters, churches or any other places which have been closed since the epidemic first reached city-wide proportions.

More automobiles are needed by the Public Health Service to transport physicians and nurses engaged in influenza nursing. Although more than one hundred cars are now being used, more are needed.

WOMEN WORKERS GIVE RIGHTS TO NURSING

A Government clerk during the day and an influenza nurse at night. This is the latest record established by women war workers. The first war worker to volunteer her services as a nurse at night is Mrs. Eleanor Sanford, a rural mail clerk in the Postoffice Department.

Mrs. Sanford closes her desk in the Government office after her day's work, she reports for duty at the Webster School, the headquarters of the Public Health Service. It is 4 o'clock then. She acts as volunteer nurse in emergency calls until midnight and is subject to call from her home until the wee hours of the morning.
