Only enlisted men are eligible to membership in the new Enlisted Service League, formed last night at a meeting in the Central Savings Bank hall.

A temporary organization was effected, with Joseph Y. Reeves as chairman. Another meeting is to be arranged for shortly, when permanent organization will be completed. A committee was appointed to this end, with H. L. Atkinson as chairman.

CHANGE ROUTE OF FIVE TRANSPORTS

Five army transports returning home with troops from France have changed their courses, the War Department announced late yesterday.

Two of them will dock at Newport News instead of New York, two at Philadelphia instead of New York and one at New York instead of Newport News.

Discovery of floating mines off the Atlantic coast has nothing to do with the change of course, it was stated. Congestion of ships in New York harbor and the fact that one transport was filled with Philadelphia men caused the changes, it was said. The transports are:

West Madaket, sailed from Brest April 12, due at Philadelphia April 28; Westford Hotel, sailed from La Pallice, Rochelle April 18, due at New York May 1; West Galea, sailed from Brest April 3, due at Newport News May 1; Liberty, sailed from Bordeaux April 15, due at Newport News May 1; and Liberator, sailed from St. Nazaire April 24, due to arrive at Philadelphia May 2.

Island Natives Attack Shipwrecked Mariners, Thinking Them Germans

NEW YORK, April 27.—Five shipwrecked sailors and the skipper of the abandoned three-masted schooner Nettie Shipman, Capt. Beryn Bradford, of Eastport, Me., arrived here aboard the steamship William B. Palmer, after harrowing experiences at sea.

The schooner, laden with 267,000 feet of lumber, became a derelict three days after leaving Jacksonville, Fla., for Antilla, Cuba, early last February. Soon the vessel became water-logged, forcing the captain and crew to the lifeboat.

On the fourth day they sighted Wallings Island, 165 miles off the coast of San Salvador. When they attempted to land the natives tried to drive them back with clubs, before finally being convinced that they were Americans.

BOLSHEVISM STILL THREATENS SWISS

GENEVA, April 27.—Switzerland is not yet out of the danger of Bolshevism, said the Lausanne Gazette in commenting upon the revelation of Bolshevist propaganda in this country.

It is learned that Lenin's instructions to his agents were: "All Swiss federal authorities and the members of the military staff shall be captured and held as hostages. The banks, railways, factories, and newspapers must be seized and placed under control."

PORK PRICES RISEN 100 P. C. SINCE 1913

Retail pork prices have jumped 100 per cent since 1913, Labor Department figures show.

Hogs are more plentiful than ever before according to Department of Agriculture figures which show that in 1918 the total number on farms was about 67,000,000 head, while it now has jumped to more than 75,000,000 head.

Storage houses are jammed with pork, according to investigations made for the United States Chamber of Commerce.

Retail pork prices, then, are not responding to the normal law of supply and demand, officials say. According to this law pork prices should drop when hogs are plentiful.

But good bacon has soared 117 per cent in prices paid at the corner grocery, nationwide surveys of the Labor Department prove. Ham has gone up 99 per cent and pork chops 98 per cent.

Similar boosts have not overtaken retail prices of other meats. Sirloin steak has jumped only 62 per cent since 1913; round steak, 75 per cent, and rib roast, but 55 per cent.

Hogs now are selling for more than \$20 per hundred pounds wholesale at the packing cities. This represents an increase of nearly \$5 per hundred pounds since March 1.

Farmers now are getting more for their hogs. But the increase in prices paid them is far below the increase in retail prices of pork cuts paid by the consumer, say officials.

SIMS TELLS HOW U-BOAT WAS FOILED

CHICAGO, April 27.—The convoy, the depth bomb and the hydrophone, or listening device.

These three agencies saved the allies from a threatened German victory on the sea and made it possible for America to send to Europe the men and materials needed to win the war.

The nature of the agencies and the story of their success were told by Admiral William S. Sims, in an address here. Admiral Sims is in Chicago to aid in the Victory loan campaign.

"When I went overseas in the summer of 1917," Admiral Sims said, "the central powers were winning the war, and we didn't know how to stop them. England knew it and Germany knew it and I soon knew it."

"In March, 1918, Germany knew we had her beaten on the sea, and she started the great land offensive. And the three agencies that saved us from Germany's expected and threatened victory at sea were:


