BRITISH REVENUE DECREASES.

London, March 31.—The Treasury statement for the financial year was issued last night. It shows: Revenue, £185,000,255 (£185,451,490); expenditure, £178,445,109 (£182,725,500). The revenue is £15,700,322 less than the previous year, when, owing largely to the late collection of the preceding year's property and income tax, the increase in receipts amounted to £72,354,150.
