SIGNS MEASURE TO CURB SKYSCRAPERS

Mitchel, Doubting Constitutionality of Bill, Seeks Veto.

MAY INFRINGE ON PROPERTY RIGHTS

Market Plan Disapproved—McCall Attacks Mayor Over Tube Building Veto.

The Mayor signed the heights of buildings bill yesterday, explaining that while he had doubts of its constitutionality he was in favor of the measure and wanted a test case made of it in the courts.

The bill divides the city into zones for the regulation of the height and character of new buildings. President McAneny, who was chairman of the special committee of the Board of Estimate which aided in drafting the bill, said he was confident the law was constitutional.

The Mayor believes it unconstitutional. "The Board of Estimate may regulate and restrict the location of trades and industries and the location of buildings designed for special purposes," some lawyers have declared that this might be construed as confiscation of property rights.

The Mayor disapproved of the bill establishing a department of markets and making it mandatory upon the city to maintain at least one terminal market in each borough.

"I disapprove this bill with the greatest reluctance," said the Mayor in a memorandum. "There is great merit in the solution it proposes for a settlement of the market problems and the consequent reduction of the unnecessarily high cost of food. In the haste with which the final draft of the bill was prepared sufficient care to insure the insertion of the permissive feature was not taken, and I am advised by the Corporation Counsel that as drawn there is ground for belief that the courts would construe the measure as mandatory."

Mr. Mitchell in his memorandum outlines the mandatory features of the bill, that the bill drafters in Albany may avoid repeating them when the matter is again presented to the Legislature.

Among other bills signed by the Mayor was one giving the Fire Commissioner power to extend the jurisdiction of the Fire Prevention Bureau over factories and to make fire drills compulsory.

Chairman McCall of the Public Service Commission issued a statement attacking the Mayor yesterday for his vetoing of the bill giving the commission the right to build any sections of the subway that work had ceased on because of the inability of the contractor to do it, because of bankruptcy or other reasons.

The bill would also permit the commission to award contracts amounting to not more than \$25,000 without public letting.

"Mayor Mitchell's veto will be very pleasing to the Contractors' Association," said Mr. McCall. "So far as I know, the only opposition to the bill, either in Albany or before the Mayor, was by a representative of that association, who denounced the bill because it provided for municipal construction."

The Mayor said he vetoed the bill after consulting with Controller Fendler and President McAneny. He said from its language it might be possible for the Public Service Commission to award contracts without the consent of the Board of Estimate.
