"I doubt if Mr. Hughes' interpretation of what should constitute the proper function of a party organization in governmental affairs will suit the Democratic Administration," said Mr. Willcox, "but I am certain it will appeal to the general run of good citizens who desire to see efficiency prevail in the management of government business."
