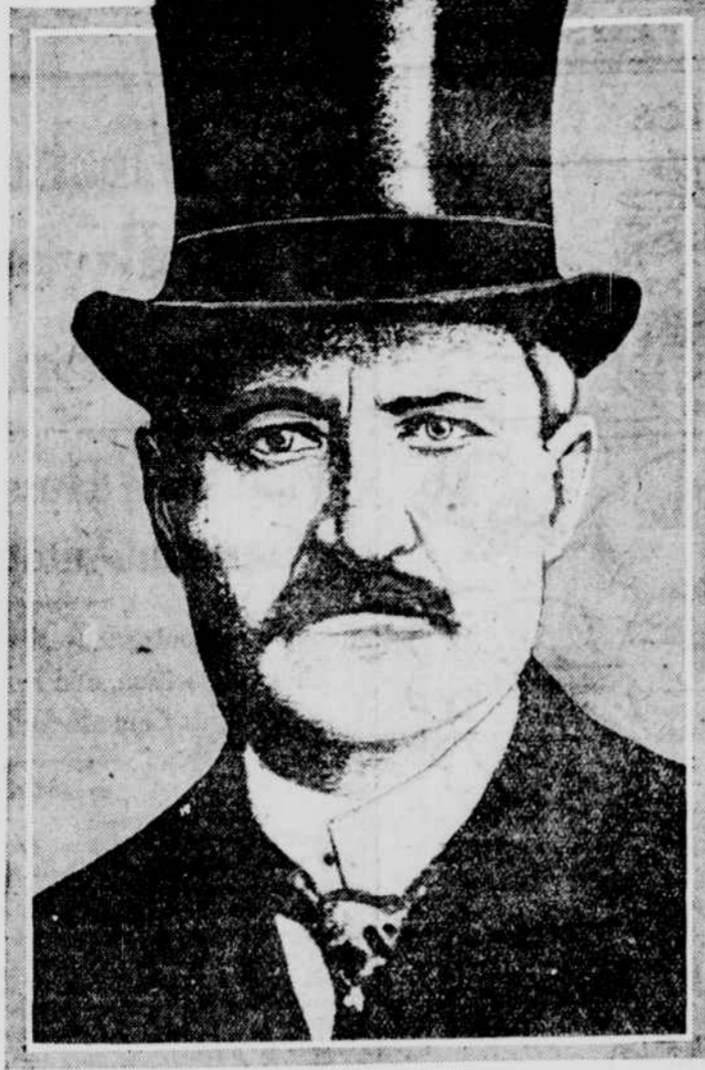

Reichstag Deputy Denounces Military Rule of Germany

Cohn, Social Democrat, Who Refused to Congratulate Hindenburg, Says Troops Are Not Fighting for Welfare of Nation, but Are Victims of Mistaken Policy

News has come through Switzerland of the extraordinarily audacious speech made in the Reichstag early in May by Deputy Cohn, of the Social Democratic party. This speech was evidently suppressed in Germany (with good reason). It was delivered on May 8.

Political Arena a Desert. "The devastation of the zone of retreat by our armies of the West has been a parallel to our domestic situation, where the political arena has also been transformed into a desert."

People Victims of Policy

Cohn is, or was, a member of the Reichstag committee appointed to consider constitutional reforms. As a member of that committee he refused to sign a message of congratulation sent to Field Marshal Hindenburg. He was criticized for this display of disrespect, and defended himself on the floor of the Reichstag.

Army Forced to Aid Loans. Cohn then formulated a series of complaints against the military administration. He emphasized the fact that the soldiers had been compelled to subscribe to the government's loans, and that in certain army corps an obligatory savings system had been introduced.

Helfferich Used By Kaiser to End Popular Unrest. Imperial Vice-Chancellor Employed Printing Presses to Produce Billions.

Karl Helfferich, German Vice-Chancellor and Secretary of the Interior, who has apparently been made one of the scapegoats in the present popular protest against the German bureaucracy, was appointed a member of the Chancellor's official family (when the Kaiser needed a resourceful financier of very liberal tendencies).

Cuban Civil Rights Suspended to Wage War More Efficiently. The "Republic of Cuba News Bureau" here received a cable dispatch yesterday from President Menocal of Cuba in which he explained his action of Friday in suspending the constitutional guarantees and calling an extra session of Congress.

3,000,000,000 Asked For U. S. Artillery. Two-thirds of This To Be Devoted to Big Guns and Munitions.

Washington, July 14.—A great artillery programme for the war will be provided for in the coming \$3,000,000,000 general deficiency appropriation bill to be considered next week by the House Appropriations Committee.

Wives in Russia Will Hand Over Fleeing Husbands

Petrograd, July 13 (delayed).—The wives of Russian soldiers are taking stern measures against deserters from the army, particularly in Central Russia, according to reports to the Petrograd newspapers. At a congress of soldiers' wives in the Province of Tambov, which was presided over by peasant women, it was unanimously resolved to "hand over to justice all deserters from the army, including, if necessary, our own husbands."

Two in Crowd That Drag Spouses to Conscription Bureau in Petrograd

The "Vedomosti" says that ten sturdy women of Koslov dragged to the conscription bureau three deserters, the wives of two of them being among the men's captors.

Finland Consents to Let Russia Have Money

Helsingfors, July 14.—As the result of parleys with the Petrograd delegation headed by M. Teichdoff, president of the executive central committee of the Councils of Workers and Soldiers' Delegates, the Finnish Diet agreed to an immediate advance of 15,000,000 marks on account of a currency loan, this sum to be followed as soon as possible by an additional 110,000,000 marks.

Split in Rumanian Cabinet; Move to Oust Premier

Jassy, Rumania, July 6 (Delayed).—A Cabinet crisis is confronting the Rumanian government. Four Conservative ministers have refused to cooperate with Premier Bratianu, and they demand that two more Conservatives be admitted to the Cabinet.
