Flemington Club Proceedings

The democratic club met Saturday for reorganization and election of officers: M. L. Payne, president; J. M. Mathews, vice president; J. K. Mixson, secretary. Messrs. Payne, Cooper and J. K. Mixson were elected delegates to the county convention, and F. S. Dupuis, John B. Floyd and D. B. Payne, alternates. M. L. Payne was re-elected executive committeeman.

The sense of the resolutions passed was: "All voters who unite with the club and pledge themselves to abide by the decision of the party and support the nominees be allowed to participate in the primaries, and all must be legally qualified, and that our delegates use their influence in the convention to have such qualifications required in the county primaries."

"We heartily endorse W. E. Allen for state railroad commissioner, believing him to possess the requisite qualifications, and will do all in our power to secure him a solid Marion county delegation, and heartily recommend him to our sister counties for their support. We heartily endorse M. L. Payne as worthy of legislative honors."

McIntosh Club

The McIntosh Democratic Club met Saturday and was reorganized by electing Mr. Wood president, Mr. Gist secretary, and Will Chambers executive committeeman.

Delegates to the county convention are Gaitskill, Burgen, Aver and Will Chambers. The following resolutions were passed:

"Resolved: That we bind ourselves to loyally support the nominees of the democratic party.

"That our delegates to the county convention be and are hereby instructed to vote as a unit and work earnestly and faithfully for a delegation to the state convention who are known to be true and cried democrats, and who will, first, last and all the time, support W. E. Allen for state railroad commissioner.

"That our delegates to the county convention make every effort to have the primary election, if any is ordered, conducted so as to prevent illegal voting. This action is taken from the fact that 1752 votes were cast in the last primary and in the regular election the highest vote for any candidate was only 863.

"Whereas: Our county executive committee, elected two years ago, for the work of the campaign and such incidental work as might intervene, did, at its meeting of April 25th, last, assume to order a primary election, and to determine the qualifications of voters in said election, and that their successors on said executive committee should be chosen by said election instead of the customary method, by the county convention. Therefore be it resolved:

"That we condemn this action and regard it as an unwarranted and dangerous usurpation of authority, vested only in the county convention, which assembles on the 25th inst., and we hereby instruct our delegates to endeavor to have the county convention to take such action as the party interests may demand."
