

MUCH INTEREST IN 1917 TOURIST CLUB

Much interest has been evinced in the proposed reorganization of the Pensacola Tourist club, and it is thought that a large number of visitors will respond to the call of President W. H. Taylor, to meet tomorrow afternoon in W. O. W. hall, on West Thomas street.

There are scores of visitors from the North here at present, and the formation of the club has been insistently urged. Some encouragement has been given the move, but unless a more healthy co-operation of Pensacola people is given, much of the interest will die out.

It is proposed, in case of a thorough organization with sufficient number, to plan for the pleasure of the visitors. At present the fact that the strangers are here is practically unknown. There is no way of saying just how many visitors for the winter are in Pensacola, whereas the organization of the Tourist club would enlist the attendance of all, and the registration of every stranger. In this way many who have friends here could easily be brought in contact with the latter.

The meeting is called for 2 p. m. Wednesday.

TRANSFER FEDERAL WITNESSES TODAY

Five federal witnesses, held on per diem in the county jail here, will leave this morning in charge of a special deputy for Tallahassee, where they will appear and give evidence in a peonage case which will be heard there before United States Judge William B. Sheppard. Court is convened here this morning for a trial of this and other important cases.

There are several government witnesses in this peonage case, but two were allowed to make bond. The others have been in the Escambia county jail for the past three or four weeks.

MONROE COUNTY UNDER QUARANTINE

Due to the establishment of tick eradication in the county of Monroe, in this state, that county has been quarantined against the outside world, announcement of which step is contained in the following bulletin from the headquarters of the state health officer, Dr. Joseph Y. Porter:

State Cattle Quarantine Line.
Notice of Quarantine and the Establishment of Tick Eradication in the County of Monroe, State of Florida.
In accordance and by authority of Chapter 4693, Acts of 1899, and Chapter 6434, No. 14, authorizing the control, suppression, and eradication of contagious and infectious diseases of live stock in the State of Florida, notice is hereby given that Monroe county, State of Florida, is quarantined, and the work of tick eradication established. Cattle infested with or exposed to the Southern Cattle Fever Tick (*Margaropus Annullatus*) disseminate the cause of "Southern," "Splentic," "Texas," or "Tick" Fever, a dangerous and frequently fatal disease of cattle.

No cattle, bulls, oxen, steers, cows, yearlings, heifers or calves shall be allowed to be driven, transported or allowed to stray across this state quarantine line into the county of Monroe except in accordance with provisions of the rules and regulations governing the control and eradication of the Southern Cattle Tick.

Members of the police department, and deputies in the sheriff's office yesterday read a notice of reward for the recovery of certain stolen jewelry which demanded more than an ordinary amount of attention. Circulars were received a few days ago, announcing that, for the recovery of two rings, stolen from the owner in New York City, a reward of \$3,000 would be paid, or \$1500 each for either, or both of them.
