A MUSEMENTS

"Picture Fire" Costs Thousands of Dollars.

It cost Jewel Productions several thousand dollars more than was originally intended to be used in the production of Borrowed Clothes, which comes to the Isis theatre tomorrow with Mrs. Charlie Chaplin in the leading role. At a well-known California bathing beach the proprietor of a large bathhouse was prevailed upon to permit the burning of a portion of his property, for a consideration.

In some manner never satisfactorily explained to Jewel Productions or the owner of the bathhouse, more oil was used to start the blaze than was scheduled. What was intended as a "picture-fire" developed into an honest-to-goodness conflagration and only fast work by the police, fire guards and members of the Universal production staff—Universal makes Jewel productions—prevented the entire beach property at the resort from being destroyed.

"It cost a pretty penny," one official of Jewel Productions said recently. "but it was worth it. That fire scene in 'Borrowed Clothes' is by far the best thing we have done in pictures of that kind. In our next 'picture-fire' however, I am not going to have any scenes made in a place where property is so high in price and panics are so easy to start."

High-Class Shows in Near Future.

According to an announcement made yesterday morning by the management of the Garden theatre, Pensacola will be favored with high-class vaudeville and road shows in the near future. Plans for the enlargement and equipment of the Garden stage are being worked out to accommodate the shows and it is understood that the alterations will be done gradually so as not to conflict with the present run of moving pictures.
