BRUCE DRY DOCKS COMPANY SUSTAINS \$4,000 FIRE LOSS

The offices and store room of the Bruce Dry Dock company took fire at 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon and were a total loss. The fire was the most spectacular one seen in the city for some time, due to the highly inflammable nature of some of the material burned including several barrels of oil and the department was obliged to fight for three hours to gain complete control of the situation. The building was a rough frame structure. T. A. Johnson, secretary and treasurer of the company, stated that the origin of the fire was unknown and that the loss amounted to about \$4,000, about one half of which was covered by insurance. It was also stated that a number of the workmen at the plant lost their tools, the fire starting after Saturday knocking off time.
