MAY CLEAR DAYS NUMBERED SEVEN, RAINED FIFTEEN

TEXTILES ARE BEING STUDIED BY GOVERNMENT

PRACTICAL WAYS OF ELIMINATING NEEDLESS EXPENSE ARE BEING WORKED OUT BY EXPERTS.

Washington, June 2.—Practical ways for eliminating needless expense now burdening the textile industries of the country are contained in a pamphlet on training textile workers now being prepared by U. S. training service of the department of labor. It is estimated that the adoption of these courses reduces by one-half the time required for workers to learn their respective tasks in the textile mills. Other special benefits claimed for training are marked reduction in accidents to employes and in damage to machinery.

At present the common practice in starting a new textile employe to work is to place him beside an old employe who is supposed to instruct the beginner as he has opportunity, in addition to performing his regular duties. Many times little or no real instruction is given and the worker has to pick up his knowledge the best way he can.

A training department such as the government experts recommend provides a special instructor who teaches the various operations according to the most approved method and carefully explains all safety regulations. The work in these training departments is not theoretical, for the learners are put on actual production and so are accustomed to conditions as they find them when transferred to the class of regular operators.

The training departments are intended for old as well as new employes. They give the former practical means for preparing for promotion or improving their performance and enable the worker to obtain a broader knowledge of the industry than would otherwise be possible. The pamphlet includes instruction for workers on pickers, cards, drving frames, fly frames, spinning frames, warpers, slasher and spoolers as well as weaving and knitting.

JACKSONVILLE TO ELECT MAYOR BY PEOPLE HEREAFTER

Tallahassee, June 2.—Senator Butler today passed through the senate the Waybright house bill creating the office of mayor of Jacksonville, after amending it to submit the matter to the voters in the general election instead of at the second primary next Tuesday and fixing the salary of that official at \$4,000 a year, straight and flat. The candidates for mayor may qualify by petition. Representative Waybright announced tonight that he would accept these amendments, which means that the bill will pass early this week all difference upon the matter having been adjusted. Jacksonville will again have a mayor elected by the people, and the campaign pledges of both Messrs. Butler and Waybright fulfilled.
