**BAPTISTS HELD MINISTER MEET AT DEFUNIAK**

THREE PASTORS FROM THIS IMMEDIATE VICINITY WERE IN ATTENDANCE AT ANNUAL INSTITUTE.

The first annual institute for Baptist ministers for the western division of Florida, which embraces all churches of the denomination west of Tallahassee, concluded its sessions yesterday at Defuniak Springs. The meeting, which was attended by about 16 ministers, including Rev. A. C. Odom, of Pensacola; Rev. W. J. Peters, of Jay, and Rev. Brock of Gonzalez, had been in session since Monday. They were guests while in Defuniak, of the Baptist church there of which Rev. R. J. O'Bryant, formerly of Pensacola, is pastor, and they report a most delightful stay there well as a most instructive meeting.

It is expected that the next annual meeting will be held at Chipley and that it will be attended by practically every minister in the district. At these institutes a regular lecture study course is carried out with the idea of broadening out ministerial work and scriptural theology. These institutes are a new departure of Baptist ministerial work in this state and bear promise of being greatly helpful in many ways.

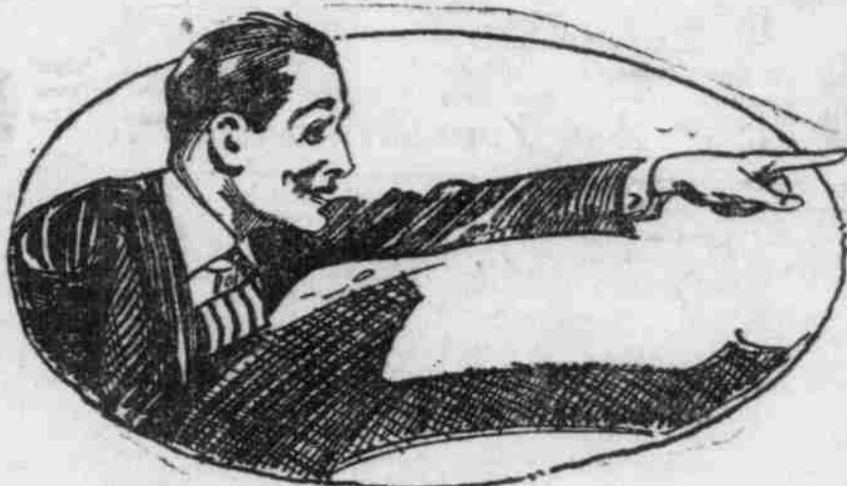
