MORE RIGID RESTRICTION ON VENDORS

PAVING OF APPROACH TO BAYOU CHICO IS PUT UP TO CITY BY COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

A survey of the eastern approach to the Bayou Chico bridge, which must be rushed to completion in order to permit the concrete steamer Cushnoc to pass out into the open sea on her trial trip, will be made by City Engineer Frank Garret today. This was decided upon yesterday afternoon when a committee composed of Gus Soderlund and J. George White, from the board of county commissioners, called upon the city commissioners, in weekly session, and put the problem squarely up to the municipality.

The question of whether the paving of the approach is a city or a county responsibility is to be determined today. The approach is a stretch of about 80 feet, lying between Barrancas avenue and the new concrete bridge and is included within the city limits. The county solons claim that it is clearly up to the city to lay the pavement.

Goes for Rolling Vendors.
Characterizing soft drink, sandwich and ice cream vendors, who ply their trade on wheels, as nuisances, Commissioner Hinrichs introduced an ordinance to require them to establish themselves 200 feet away from business houses which carry the same line of goods. A penalty for violation of the ordinance provides for a fine of \$25 or a 29-day imprisonment. The ordinance now in effect pertaining to this class of merchants provides that they pay a \$50 weekly license and that they remain stationary.

The American National Bank, the sole local bidder Saturday night, withdrew as did Ray Daum, of Silverman and Huyck, Cincinnati, leaving a clear field to Steiner Bros., W. L. Slayton, J. C. Slayton's bid, the second highest, was for par and accrued interest, plus a premium of \$227.50 for immediate delivery with the same premium offered for deferred deliveries of \$25,000 every 30 days.

Discussion of technicalities delayed the final outcome. Alfred Holman, for J. C. Mayer & Co., Steiner Bros.'s most persistent opponent Saturday night, again contended that the terms of Steiner's bid were not legal.

So great was the argument, with the decision hanging in the balance for hours, that Mr. Holman called for an auction sale, offering to start the ball rolling with an offer of a \$100 premium. This was rejected by the board.

STEINER BROS. ARE AWARDED TIME WARRANTS

AWARD MADE BY SCHOOL BOARD FOR \$150,000 IMPROVEMENT WARRANTS AFTER STRONG COMPETITIVE BIDDING.

Sig Steiner, of Steiner Bros., of Birmingham, outbid every competitor yesterday afternoon when the school board disposed of \$150,000 in time warrants which will be used for educational purposes in Escambia county. After hours of discussion, in which the various bond buyers, the board and their attorney, Judge Carter, joined, the contract was awarded to Mr. Steiner and the deal closed. This was for the 5 1-2 per cent bids which the board decided to receive Saturday night with the right to the 6 per cent bids reserved. Mr. Steiner was high man on both occasions.

The winning bid was a clear \$1,428.00 over the next highest from Fred Dean, of W. L. Slayton Co., Toledo. It was for par and accrued interest plus a premium of \$1,710 with immediate deliveries. This was one of two propositions offered by Mr. Steiner, the first being for par and accrued interest, plus
