RED CROSS TEAMS ARE ARRANGING FOR DRIVE

Captains Are Lining Up Teams and Attending Other Preliminaries.

Red Cross activities in relation to the Roll Call, which will be launched in Pensacola November 11th, Armistice Day, has taken a new life, with team captains making their appointments, and all preliminary plans getting under way.

W. K. Hyer, chairman, who assisted by Malcolm R. Ponge, vice-chairman, is optimistic as to the outlook, owing to the fact that the home service section of the Red Cross has done such effective work, not only nationally but locally.

Mr. Hyer, in speaking of the work that is before the committees and the necessity for close organization, said: "The work of the Red Cross has not reached its height in the United States, by any means. While hostilities were supposed to have ceased with the signing of the armistice, which the roll call commemorates, the main work of the Red Cross consists in aiding in every possible way the reconstruction program.

"What the Red Cross has done in the past in Pensacola has been formally recognized by national headquarters, which cited this city for its splendid work in the emergency relief campaign. The people of Pensacola have stood by the Red Cross in the past because the Red Cross has stood by them and we be trusted in them for the success of this roll call, as for every campaign in which their support has been enlisted."
